



RED O'ROURAE'S RICHES - Eggleston & Richardson. CAVALIER Mar. 2-9-16 -23-30-Apr.6-13-20- 1912. A hidden civilization on a desert mountain with a veritable El Dorado civilization. Fantasy is incidental. THE MONSTER FLEA - Knight-Adkin. PEARSONS Feb. 1906. A huge model of a common flea is endowed with the leaping properties of that animal

proportionately. Pretty good.

MORE NEWS OF THE HOMEBIRD - Hodgson. BLUEBOOK Aug. 1907. A giant ctab attacks a ship in the Sarasso. Chiefly important because of its connection to the same aithor's THE BOATS OF THE GLEN CARRIG in setting.

TOM EDISON JR, 'S ELECTRIC SEA SPIDER - Phillip Reade. THE NUGGET LIB RARY Feb. 11, 1892. High adventure with an electric spider that goes chasing about the sea in the best of Frank Reade tradition. THE MAN IN THE AIR - Keates. THE SCAP BOOK May 1906. An antigravity device goes haywire, sending its operator into outer space. IN SATURN'S RINGS - Tyson. A man is teleported to Saturn, which He finds to be populated by Saturnians and by Earthmen whom the Saturnians cannot perceive. He succeeds in returning, only to find that a Hindu has taken over his body. Disembodied, he occupies several friends' persons; thereupon ensues a most confusing mess of words, that never seem to mean anything. SCRAP BOOK Sept. 1910. THE ONLY MAN ON EARTH - Kentnor. Disease exterminates the population of earth. Very good.

THE DEVIL SHIP - Couzens. CAVALIER Feb. 17, 1912. Not fantasy. THE DEVIL LIGHT - Wallace. ALLSTORY July 22. 1916. A young man classifies lights as to c minor, etc, until he gets white, the abominable which he cannot stand. He becomes a zeppelin pfficer, but a white

search light kills him.

A DEAL IN INVENTIONS - Pladwell. ALLSTORY Jan. 5, 1918. The only fantasy is a motivating attempt to steal a new device.
OLD DOG, NEW TRICKS - Robbins. ALLSTORY Jan.19, 1918. Psychological. THE PEOPLE OF THE GLACIER series: THE GREAT COLD, ALLSTORY Mov. 1, 119 THE PASSING OF THE GREAT COLD, Dec. 20, 1919; FIRE, Jan 3, 1920. THE COURSE OF CAVE LOVE, Jan. 17, 1920; WINGS AGAINST CAVE WALLS, Jan. 31, 1920; A NEWER DAWN, Feb. 14, 1920. All these depict the trials, tribulations, and achievements of a Neanderthaler civilization.

A SYMPOSIUM STYLED COLUMN CONDUCTED Ву DONALD SUSAN

INrecent years much ado has been made by various authors and collectors concerning what constitutes the basic science fiction library. This has been in keeping with the rise of science fiction as a literature of its own, peculiar to itself. But fantasy, a variety of imaginative literature far older and far more varied and general in its catagorical range has been rather ignored. In keeping with the trend I shall consider science fiction as something apart from fantasy and devote this column to a discussion of what constitutes the basic FANTASY library.

Twenty-five books was the number I selected as being most convenient as a basic library...but in the listing ten books of the twenty-five are chosen as a group to be more necessary than the others.

August Derleth, a noted author, publishing director of Arkham House (the fantasy publishing firm), and very noted collector, offers the following list NOT restricted to twenty-five. (Admittedly, twenty-five was arbitrarily chosen as that number of books that costs from \$75. to \$100, a fairly arbitrary calculation.)

The Ace Double Novel Pb CRY PLAGUE and Judas GOATare, respectively, about bacterological warfare and diametics, although the latter is only satirized in an otherwise plain detective novel.

SINISTER STONES by Arthur W. Upfield. (Doubleday, 1954; \$\varphi^2.75)

A detective story set in Western Australia wherein the natives use effective forms of divination and threaten to solve the case. Good novel of its kind.

BRIEF CANDLES by Manning Coles. Humorous ghost story.

THE ETERNAL SMILE AND Other Stories by Par Lagerkvist (translated)
Random House, 1954; 4.50) Assorted stories of serious intent which deal with various types of afterlife.

THE CAPERBERRY BUSH by Jack Guinn. (Little, Brown and Co., 1954;

\$\pi_3.95\$) Humorous and satirical work about politics wherein a scientist developes a potent truth serum and administers it to politicians.

CHILDREN OF THE WIND by Burgess Drake. (J.P.Lippincott., 1954; 33.50)

A novel narrated by a poltergeist, one of two (who are both unborn children), about the haunted household; serious and moving for the most part.

GRATEFUL TO LIFE AND DEATH by R.K. Narayan. (Michigan State College Press, 1954; 3.00) Novel about love beyond the grave and the happy married life before the death of the protagonist's wife.

ESCAPE TO EDEN by Theddore Pratt. (Gold Medal Books.a Po..1953;35¢) Scientist discovers how to make plain dirt fission and tries to escape its dangerous threat to his peace of mind by taking himself to an island paradise.

SPINSTERS IN JEOPARDY by Ngaio Marsh (Little, Brown and Co,1953; #3.00) Dope ring and a cult that combines drugs perversion and black magic; contains a description of a black mass ritual.

GERMAN STORIES AND TALES - edited by Robert Pick. (Alfred A. Knopf, 1954; \$3.95) Contains Franz Karka's Metamor-phosis, the tale of man found himself turned into 5ft long cockroach.




