Lawdale visits Forrester, and at the next meeting between Forrester and Keenton; Forrester and his wife are the real parents of Miriam; Keenton's real name is Stoningham, and he is mad from some sort of blight. And Lawdale succeeds in pulling him back to some semblance of sanity; he tells Lawdale that the dreadful secret Valdoza is hunting for is the cure of the blight - for he knows how to cause it, but not how to cure. Valdoza, meanwhile, plays his trump card: he causes a huge epidemic of brain blight in the area, hoping to get the doctor mobbed, but Keenton succeeds in curing everyone without divulging his secret. Dr. Keenton now tells of the peculiar properties of certain plants stolen from Central America by Valdez; the perals contain the basis for the blight, the sap for the whirling death.

The doctor visits Valdez and captures him, then kills him and commits suicide, after ordering Lawdale to destroy the entire supply of whirling death.

In spite of its monstrous length and disappointing low spots in places, it holds together well and is quite enjoyable.

In reviewing this story I have cut out Dr. Keenton's story, his plot concerning Forrest, and a dozen other minor schemes and plots that came to nothing. However, I have no interest in taking up 3 or 4 whole columns with this material, so I leave that to him who can procure and read it.

ZAPT'S REPULSIVE PASTE - Giesy. ALLSTORY Nov. 29, 1919.

Xenophon Xerxes Zapt, the irrespressible (and irresponsible) professor, conceals a paste which has the peculiar property of lifting into the air things which inadvertently become smeared with it, ranging from kittens to policemen, Fair, but must have been lots better when published.

THE MASTER OF BLACK - Fisher. ALLSTORY WEEKLY Mar. 20, 1920.

Arrinel the scientist and Crabtree the financier have a private war, whose first offensive action is the darkening of all Crabtree's lights. This develops into a rather confused plot-and-counterplot, the gist of which is that Crabtree's son, his daughter and her fiancée have banded together and, by depriving everyone of light - first dimness, and then causing utter black - he forces through various reforms he desires. Good.

CITIZEN 504 - Palmer. ARGOSY Dec. 1896.

In a future world, a cityless superagrarian world, a typographical error occurs in the Bureau of Marriages, leading to somewhat amusing results.

THE AVENGING TIGER - Brooman. ARGOSY Jan. 1897.

The protagonist is saved by a servant from a crocodile, and in return makes said servant a very privileged character - more of a comrade than a servant. However, on the night before he was to be married the unfortunate fellow was found stabbed to death. However, the man's brother, hunting with the protagonist, meets and is killed by a huge tiger - with the eyes of the murdered Byndar, and who knows his name. Rather good.

THE BOOJOO MAN - Lincoln. AINSLEE'S Sept. 1904.

Jehiel Bailey gains possession of a sorcerous image-which doesn't work the way he expected! It does, however, work well enough to make this story fantasy, and an interesting proto-UNKNOWN style story.

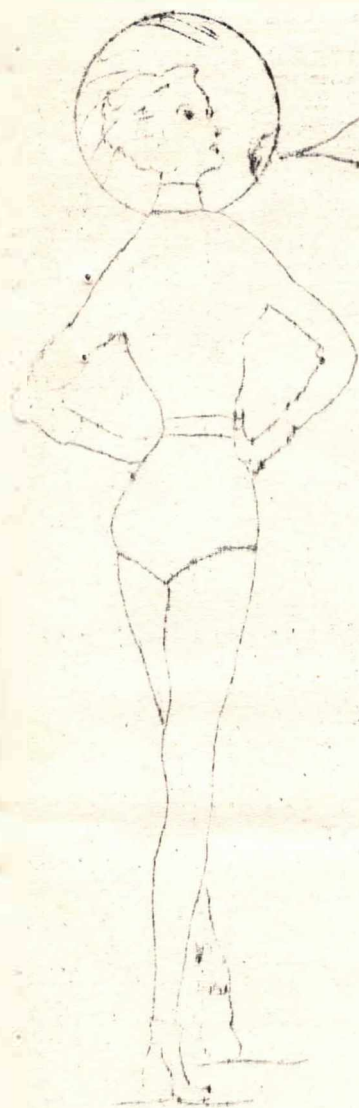

THE DARK CHILD by Camara Laya. Translated by James Kirkup, Ernest Jones, and Elaine Gottlieb. (New York, Noonday Press, 1954; \$2.75) An autobiography laid in Africa; the author's mother supposedly had the gift of prophecy and an immunity which allowed her to swim in a crocodile infested pool.

LOST ISLAND by Graham Kellnes. (New York, The World Publishing Co., 1954; \$3.50) An island volcano contains a cave wherein one may by steering oneself extend one's lifespan; two dozens of this isle have lived since Drake's day.

RAPTURE IN MY RAGS by Phyllis Hastings. (New York, E.P. Dutton and Co. 1954; \$3.00) A scarecrow comes to life.

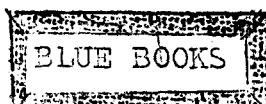
