TEE SCIENCE-FICTION hSSOCLiTION is now over eight months old. During that eight months, considerable experience has been gained in the running of the society, and we propose to utilise this experience by reorganising the society to some extent, in several stages during the next fow months, The reorganisation will be designed to make the running of the society more efficient than at present.

The first step in this reorganisation will be to ensure the demucratic nature of the association by the introduction of a Council, to be elected annualy by all existing mernbers:

The Council will consist of seven merbers of the society residing in the Brivish Islos, who will commacate and make their decisions via the pozt. It will be responsible for appointing an Executive Comittee of three members who, for the period of one year, unless dismissea by the Council, will have full executive control of the fasociation.

The nembers of the Fxecutive Committee will be responsible for running the society to the best of their ability, and will be in charge of financial and secretarial matters. They will also be responsible for delegating other official duties to various members, and for enrolling new members, granting charters to branches, and handijng the general executive work of the Association.

Al new schemes intronuced by the Executive Committee must first be outlined in the official monthly journal of the society - as in the past - and only put into operation should the response of nembers be satisfactory. Although the approval of the Council is unnecessary for any action of the Committee, any such action may be rescinded by a decision of the Council. Also, any complaints against an action of the fxecutive Committee should be made to the Council. IN HuL CrSES, THE DECISIOIT OF THECOUIVCİ (i.e., five members assenting. IS FINA工. It should be understood, however, that the Council is not an executive or legislative body: it is an elected body to which all disputes, or questions of policy, may be referred.

It now renains for the first Council to be elected. Enclosed is a list of the twelve most prominent British members of the Association. Every member is requested to place a cross against seven of the names, representing his or her choice of Council. The form shoula then be signed and returned to Feadquarters before October 30th. Torms received after this date, or forms suonitted by members whose subscripuions are overdue, vill not be considered. The seven members Who receive the most vobes vill constitute the Council until December 31st, 1938 .
