In Brief --

This issue will be mailed Noon, Tues., 9 Oct. to all subscribers, who are asked to note the date of receipt of this and future issues, and to send us this info the next time you write, renew your sub, etc. (Use it as an opportunity for an LoC....) This will help us develop a statistical picture of how the p.o. is treating SOTWJ (it seems to be going 3rd-class in some cases....). Also, pls. let us know if anyone has any problems (postage due, e.g.) with this issue because of its 12-page size.

All you who received TWJ #82--please write an LoC--we want to build #83 around a large and lively lettercolumn. To date, we've received 4-5 letters--mostly about Harlan Ellison's letter, but no one has commented on Mae Strelkov's article. We are particularly interested in getting some feedback for her; this will be especially helpful in guiding the direction her TWJ material takes in the future.

TWJ progress report: Brian Burley has started running off the snake-bitten #80; we have hopes this will be out in Nov. #83 is in progress, but badly needs material: LoC's, articles, essay-type reviews, bibliographic material, fiction are all in very short supply in our files. And Jack Chalker has found the missing artwork, so things are looking up almost all fronts! (Now, if we can only come up with a back-up mimeo or offset plus a live-wire co-editor....)

SOTWJ #108 is on stencil, and will be run off shortly after this issue. #'s 109 and 110 are half-finished. ## We will shortly begin a new series of indices for SOTWJ (will do Vol. 17 in #110, Vol. 18 in #111 or 112, and will work backwards from there every 2-3 issues, indexing current vols. in 2nd or 3rd issue of following volume) and TWJ. Older SOTWJ/TWJ indices are "inoperative"; more in #109.

No room for review of FAPA Mailing #144; will do in SOTWJ 110 or next FAPA issue.

. . . I've only bought VERTEX the first, but saw the other two; I've bought one VAULT OF HORROR, after someone wrote advising me it was worth the effort and should be supported; and I've been buying each WEIRD TALES including the fiftieth anniversary year. Now VoH is retired; I wonder what new title will be brought out and by whom--and if they will cease publication without giving it a chance to build up a circulation.

Nostalgia should interest some FAPAns, including me.

Perhaps in FAPA issues of SOTWJ you might do more than list the zines and stuff . . . ; how about underlining ones of general interest, or those that could be received from editors for a fee, even if they are apazines? The INCOMPLEAT TERRY CARR is readable; it is the sort of thing fans regardless of fan location should enjoy. Actually the list is useful to me--I've not been able to read all of all mailings and your notes can help me remember to go back to read what seems especially interesting--the Renault articles, for instance.

. . . I like SOTWJ because of its news value mainly. It puts lots of information in compact form. I'd like to see a zine with straight news, covering pro and fan fields--done something like professional news mags. But as I don't have time to work up contributors, and don't know others who will, I think your zine, plus LOGUS, does quite a bit--with LUNA MONTHLY . . . .

Maybe a combo newszine/letterzine with factual emphasis would be a worthwhile experiment, with editor prodding for info in areas he knows it is to be had. By "prodding", I mean follow-up of clues of news, of things to come, new pubs of fannish nature, and so on.

((The recent history of new prozines has not been encouraging--HAUNT OF HORROR, VISION OF TOMORROW, the Lowndes mags, etc. We only hope the WEIRD TALES revival will be successful, appealing to both old (especially in terms of nostalgia) and new fans alike. We urge all SOTWJ readers to support WT by buying copies, talking it up wherever possible, and writing letters of support and encouragement to SaM and Margulies. ## Perhaps you have missed it, but we have been noting in the FAPA listings those 'zines which are avail. outside of FAPA, and have been noting that these will be reviewed in greater depth in a later issue of SOTWJ. (We have presented these general reviews in non-FAPA issues of SOTWJ, for the benefit of our non-FAPA readership, so most FAPA members have not seen these reviews. And THE INCOMPLEAT TERRY CARR was one such 'zine reviewed--in SOTWJ #101.) Actually, the listing of FAPA Mailings is for the benefit of our non-FAPA readership more than for the FAPAns...it is included in the FAPA issues only because some of the FAPA members (such as yourself) have indicated that they find such listings of use. ## One of our greatest problems is lack of time--which keeps us from actively seeking new contributors and news sources to the extent we would like. Our greatest need is for a co-editor who does have the time.... --ed.))

I am properly horrified at what is. However, I feel that much of the info you print is of little use in the form in which you present it, and SOTWJ can be no permanent reference unless you present cumulative indexes. Geez, I hate to see you going to all that work for nothing.

((After we have completed the year 1973, we plan to publish a cumulative index of sorts (probably in THE WSFA JOURNAL) for the year, with cross-references, plus an article or special feature of some kind on a particular aspect of the 1973 prozines (we'll cover a different aspect ea. year). Unfortunately, TWJ is not sent thru FAPA (for various reasons, we must limit press runs).... --ed.))
