Section 5. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account and official record of all business transacted, shall receive all club funds and keep them in a repository approved by the other club officers, and shall pay out funds only on an order signed by at least one other officer, who, together with the Treasurer, shall be responsible to the membership for such transactions. The Treasurer shall submit a full report to the membership of all business transacted each quarter year. The Treasurer shall also keep a full and accurate record of each member's dues status and shall notify the Corresponding Secretary two weeks before each member's dues become payable.

Section 4. Corresponding Secretary. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all official correspondence of the club, shall receive Questionnaices of prospective members, mail invitations to join to approved applicants, and keep an accurate record of memberships. The Corresponding Secretary shall mail dues notices to each member ten days before such dues become payable. The Corresponding Secretary shall keep himself informed of all activities within the Club; shall maintain contact with all State Secretaries and cooperate with them in State-level affairs of the club, and shall submit reports of club activity to the membership in each issue of the Official Organ.

Section 5. Official Editor. The Official Editor shall be responsible for the publication of a least six issues of the Official Organ each year.

Section 6. Activities and Benefits Committee Chairman. The Activities and Benefits Committee Chairman shall keep the membership

Section 7. Historian.
