Two DeepSouthCon Bids for '95

There are two announced bids for the DeepSouthCon for 1995. To help you make your site selection decision, I have asked for a letter from each of the bid chairs to tell us a little about their bids. Irvin Koch of Alexandria, VA and Ken Moore of Nashville, TN have both filed with Conjuraction (DSC XXXI) letters of intent to bid and letters of intent from their prospective hotels. Following are their verbatim responses.

Irvin Koch, Bid Chairman

Name: DSCXXXIII = Arlington, VA DSC (Just like DSC XX was Chattanooga DSC except I have to distinguish it from Arlington, TX, which is also eligible for DSC and where our button maker is based). "Northern VA," for those not from this area, is the 3 VA counties/cities that are the center of the VA suburbs of DC: Fairfax, Arlington, and Alexandria. They are actually further South than Louisville and certainly further South than Winchester, VA.

Place: Rosslyn Westpark Hotel (Best Western), (Rosslyn is technically a neighborhood in Arlington, a fancy one, but).

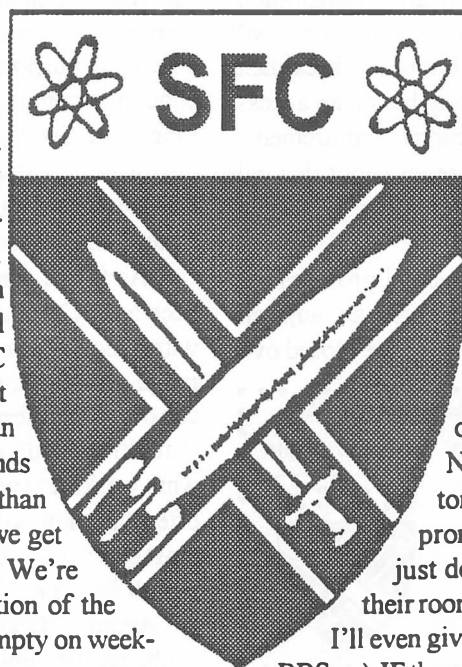
June 2-5, 1995: Standard DSC with committee present in hotel the night before "just in case," registration starting about noon Fri ... put it this way, we have the facilities from 8 am Fri. to 5 pm Sun. There will of course be some sort of Dead Dog party in the Con HQ Suite, Sun PM. There will be one track of program, starting from about 6pm Fri and running until as late as 2pm Sun though I doubt it'll really go past Noon, wrapping up with the Site Selection for '97. Other than the fact about 2 or 3 dozen pro sf writers and artists are in local phone distance, it'll be a standard DSC program. We hope to concentrate just on those in "Northern, VA." The fan aspect and fans coming to see their friends aspect will be much higher priority than the program. On the other hand, if we get swamped, we can upgrade VERY fast. We're also only using a VERY small fraction of the facilities and this Hotel is normally empty on week-ends, especially at that time of the year.

There will be a standard DSC Art Show/Auction, Huxters' Room, and Masquerade. We'll be running them on the standard DSC/TN/KY/GA schedule, not like the cons up here do. You don't even want to know how they run cons up here.

The Con Suite will run 24 hours (except during the dance) and is a function room style suite but there will be plenty of chairs. Yes, there will be a Dance, Sat PM after the masquerade or maybe during. The Hotel has it's peculiarities: one is that they INSIST on throwing in \$X amount of food and drink at no extra charge for the price of the facilities. Another is they don't want the consuite in a sleeping room and threw in an extra function room at no extra charge. (We won't tell them about the dead dog party....) A third is they want the Con suite closed during the dance. Hmmm; they must think they can sell stuff at a

cash bar then. Oh well, that'll be a good time for everyone to party anyway. Or people CAN walk down the street to the local night-life -- this IS NOT an inner city -- but its not a real suburb either -- it's Arlington, VA.

Basically, were not trying for a big fancy con for everyone in the universe. We could if we had to, but DSC has settled down, I like it or not, to a small specialized con for "Southern Fandom." If you're reading this, you're one of them and so are your friends. If you're NOT reading this and are in a movie tonight, instead, you ain't. (NO, I don't promise we won't have movies or video. We just don't plan any. Gamers can game from their rooms if they want and so can Computerists; I'll even give them the phone numbers of good local BBSes.) IF there is enough interest, there might be a Live



Role Playing Game but I didn't book facilities for them. Committee: Irv Koch, Chair, Frank Ney, Keith Lynch, Jean Yarsawich, Zanny Leach, Mike Dillson, Ellen VarTanoff, Vern Clark, Rusty Burke, Dick and Nicki Lynch, and Terrilee Edwards-Hewitt. Basically, there were enough people from Tennessee who'd moved up here, plus some locals I've done stuff with over the last few years, plus the Leach-Dillson household, we could do a con. So we will, if y'all vote us in.

Ken Moore, Bid Chair

We are bidding for DeepSouthCon 33 in 1995. Our site, the Clubhouse Inn, is located in downtown Nashville, three straight blocks from an interstate exit and about a mile and a half from the Parthenon in Centennial Park. It was the downtown Sheraton formerly, and Kubla Khan was located there for several years. Our intention is to hold DeepSouthCon in conjunction with our annual convention, and we have selected the dates of May 12th through the 14th.

The facility has been renovated, but not just cosmetically. Such features as the air conditioning have been modernized. Also, a portion of the former ballroom has been closed off and is now an amphitheater which can seat 90-130 people. There are six function rooms on the main floor and two on the second floor. We are being provided with a separate (garage level) room as consuite space; it was the lounge, and is pleasantly roomy and functional, including bathrooms. It is handicap-accessible via the elevator from the lobby (and other floors). The function space is great!

Room rates will be \$75.00 for 1-4 occupants per night. Suites will be \$85.00. Each registered hotel guest will receive a free ticket for the breakfast bar (a full breakfast, not just pastries and coffee). Regarding handicap access, there are sleeping rooms which meet current requirements, and they are scheduled for bathroom renovations that will better serve those needs. Twelve spacious suites are available for parties.

Despite its downtown location, the hotel provides free parking in a garage underneath and also an adjacent surface lot. Surrounding businesses which are closed over

the weekend have surface lots that we can utilize if need be.

We want to bring DeepSouthCon to Nashville. It is our desire to engage the interest of fen throughout the south-east, and elsewhere, through our choice of guests and our varied programming concepts. The committee is really excited about the hotel and the ideas we have, not only for making this a DSC to remember, but also as a chance to promote southern fandom.

What's happening to the DSC?


In the last issue I asked everyone's opinion of what is happening with the DSC, and I did receive a few replies. They are as follows:

Irv Koch: DSC never did catch hold as the Southern version of Westercon. For 3-5 years, a few people tried to turn it around. It was too late. It was started by one regional circle of friends, and that is now all it is POSSIBLE to get plus some locals plus what would normally come to another con with which DSC is combined. "Southern Fandom" got what it asked for, 25 years ago; "you get what you wish for." Fortunately this group of 150-250 people, plus locals and/or the normal population of a local con with which DSC is combined, is a viable permanent convention. It's just that it's a specialized con rather than a general purpose con. The group is self-perpetuating enough to continue for the near or mid-future. That time range has always been good enough for this group; it'll have to do. If it does dwindle back to people's living rooms, no one outside those living rooms will care--because "they" made sure of it. My point is, "Don't sweat it."

As far as combination with local cons: that too has been a DSC tradition, not a bad one. It can be combined with a local con in the May-Oct (preferable Jun-Aug) time range, and run by that con com... or an independent group can do it... preferably on the first weekend in June (the new "traditional" date). History and pragmatism have shown what works and what doesn't. The voters have been more often than not willing to vote for what does not...and in most cases the con operators have been prepared to pay for it with few complaints.

Again, "Don't sweat it." (It wouldn't hurt, though, to change the minuscule written DSC rules to proclaim the

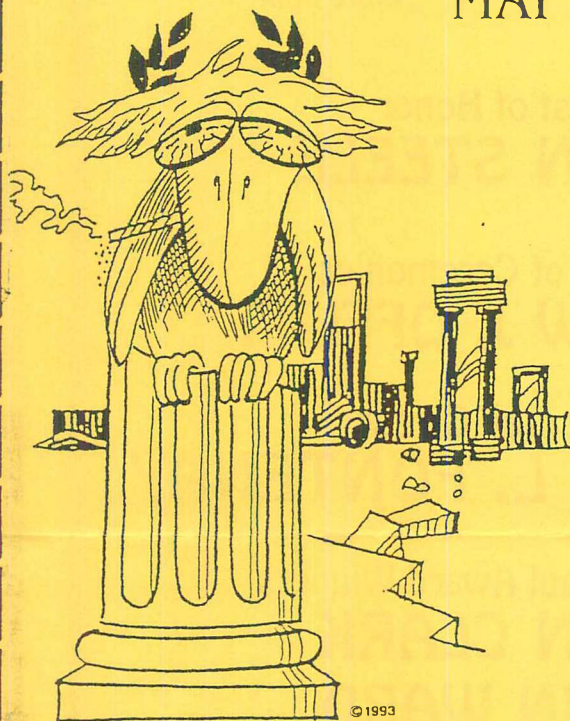

first weekend in June as the “preferred date” and outright forbid anything earlier than May 1, later than Sep 30, less than 9 months or more than 15 months from the con before it. Of course, no one will enforce the rules) DSC never was WesterCon. It maybe should have been. It wasn’t. We can live with what we have. Don’t cry now.

Ed. note: Irv, no crying just questioning. Of the last 11 DSC’s, 7 were in June. I still would like to see the DSC have the stature of being the Southern convention to attend. If all of the Southerners supported and attended the DSC there would be several thousand fans at the convention. Okay Southerners, why don’t you support the DSC?

Sunn Hayward: Oh, boy— how to stop the decline of the DSC?? Perhaps there are too many Southern cons, or maybe Southern fandom is shrinking. For my vote, the DSC could be combined with an existing local or regional con, as these are the personnel who are most likely to put on a DSC anyhow. As for fixed dates, that may impact negatively on hotel availability. Support could be increased by making the younger fen aware of DSC’s existence. It has, for instance, no focus aside from fellowship (that is, DSC is not a Trek, or horror, or gaming con), which concept may be a bit intangible to young whippersnappers. Send out emisaries! Having GAFIATED, that’s all the valid input which I have.

Ed note: Thanks, Sunn, for your comments. Many of the DSC’s have had gaming, but only as a small part of the convention itself.

Naomi Fisher: I don’t know what, if anything, could stop the decline of the DSC’s. I tend to support the idea of a fixed weekend to bid on, but in practice that might be pretty difficult. Everyone seems to agree summer is the right time (real pool parties), but glancing over J.R.’s listing of cons, it’s hard to see what weekend wouldn’t conflict too badly with a pre-existing con. Plus, since the site moves around, while one weekend in, say, Louisville wouldn’t conflict with nearby conventions, it might well cause problems in Mobile or Knoxville. It’s also a nice idea to say DSC should be combined (as indeed it so often has been) with a pre-existing convention, but that sets up the double problem of 1.) possible difficulty in changing pre-existing hotel agreements (is it just me, or do hotels like to be able to count on a full weekend at the same time each year?) and 2.) not being able to throw a DSC unless you’re already “entrenched” in the local fannish power structure. We all know outstanding fans who’ve been closed out of the local con committee, sometimes even after they helped start the convention. I figure that if someone wants a DSC, hasn’t been caught and committed, is able to make the appropriate logistical arrangements and can WIN the bid, let ’em have it. Can you guess I don’t wanna be a BNF; I’m much too unambitious. There aren’t any easy solutions. I personally think more publicity would only help the average DSC and

would be inclined to mail a few fliers/registration forms to every club I could get a listing for, to be distributed at their meetings. If you’re not in con-going fandom it may be hard to find, let alone believe in. That’s one of the SFC’s problems, too. By its nature it’s pretty much limited to con-goers, since that’s the only place you’re likely to find out about it.

Ed. note: Thanks for your comments on the DSC. My main reason for bringing up the subject was to get different people brain-storming about the DSC’s. I don’t know if there will be changes, or if people will be willing to set a (preferred) weekend for the DSC, but it might help.

Convention Reports

This is something new for me, as I have never reviewed a convention. I have attended a lot of them, and talked with Steve and others about them, but haven’t put it in print. If you are totally bored with what I write, then please volunteer to write con reports for me. Well, here goes...

CHATTACON: Chattacon is the first convention Steve and I attend each year. We try to leave the house by 6 a.m. so we can arrive at the hotel by noon. It was amazing that we managed to leave on time. We arrived at the Read House about noon, and I went in to register while Steve parked the car. I ran into Lee Sessoms at the hotel registration desk and talked to him while the hotel folks finished taking care of his business. The front desk person that we dealt with was helpful in taking care of our reservations and was fast and efficient. We took our keys and went upstairs to check out our suite. We had requested a larger suite, as we were planning to do a Rivercon party. It was a decent-sized room in the old part of the hotel. If you haven’t stayed at the Read House, then you do not know that the size and layouts of the suites vary greatly. However, they all still cost the same. We went down to get our luggage and ran into Jack Heazlitt. He volunteered (was shanghaied) into helping us unload our car, party supplies included. Thanks, Jack. We then went to the con registration desk for our badges and program books. The first programming we attended was opening ceremonies where they introduced their guests. GoH: David Gerrold, GoH: Glen Cook, Artist GoH: Larry Elmore, Special Guest: Ben Bova, TM: Brad Strickland, Regional Artist GoH’s: Lori & David Deitrick. Their FGoH was drawn out of folks who had pre-registered for the convention. The winner was Jim Arnold who lives in Chattanooga. They

had to send rovers out to find their FGoH. Unfortunately Bob Tucker was to have attended Chattacon, but could not due to the illness of his son, the (real) Bob Tucker. Friday we went to room parties: Phoenixcon (Atlanta), Constellation (Huntsville), Baltimore in '98, Conjunction (1993 DSC), and the Jeff Barnes (welcome home) and Zielke party. Because of our early Friday morning and no nap we crashed about 1:00 a.m. Sorry, guys.

Saturday morning we went down to the restaurant for breakfast, only to find it closed. It does not open until lunch time. We then decided to check out the con suite. They had instant oatmeal, packages of sweet rolls, cold cereal, hot chocolate, coffee and tea. Steve and I chose instant oatmeal and a cup of hot chocolate. Morning is definitely the time to go into Chattacon's consuite. It wasn't full of smoke. I guess if I had any complaint about Chattacon, it would be that there is not a non-smoking consuite. I usually just avoid the consuite there because my eyes do not like the smoke and get irritated. I was on an 11 a.m. panel titled "If this was my first Con." The other panelists were J. Webb, and Jim Arnold (FGoH). All of the panelists told stories about their first con, and if they could do it over what they would do now. We also asked the audience the same questions. The panel started out slow but turned out to be a lot of fun. It was the first appearance of our FGoH. After the panel was over we wandered through the huskster room and talked to friends. We then went to lunch in the hotel restaurant which was pleasant until the cooks got into a disagreement. Our waitress went over and told them that they were too loud and to be quiet. Steve, Susan Stockell and I went shopping for party supplies. We used Susan's car, because Steve didn't want to lose his great parking spot. We found the local Sam's Wholesale, bought what we needed and headed back to the hotel. Susan was very lucky and found a great place to park in the garage. We unloaded our party supplies and both started setting up our individual parties for that night. The only party other than RiverCon's that I attended was the Nashville DSC bid party. They had a Greek theme for their party, and I had to go see Ken Moore in a toga, a sight no one should miss. Thanks to Jeff Barnes and the Zielke party for their donation of the leftover keg of beer. It lasted through all of our party, and then was taken down to the consuite Sunday morning.

Steve was on a panel Sunday at 12:00 noon on "Fannish Myths and Legends." Ken Moore was also on the panel and they asked Jack Heazlitt to sit in as well. We left after the panel was over as we had a 6-hour drive ahead of us. I turned the radio on to listen to the 49ers game on the way home. After the third quarter I turned off the radio. Steve does not like it when my team loses, as I'm not a good loser. We had a good time at Chattacon. Their

attendance was approximately 1500.

RUBICON: Rubicon was held in Lexington at the Marriott Griffin Gate. It is a small relaxacon of about 60 fans. They have two consuites, the main one (where most everyone hangs out) was for non-smokers, and the other one was used for gaming, video and was also for smoking. Some fans smoke in the elevator lobby. Larry Smith, Bookseller was the only huskster at the con selling books. Jane and Scott had some buttons available also. Sally Kobbie brought in two jigsaw puzzles which kept 7-8 people (not necessarily the same ones) busy from Friday evening until late Saturday evening. The puzzle was a picture of boxes of Cracker Jacks with loose crackerjacks for the background.

This was a very active group of fans, demonstrating it by breaking the table leg Saturday evening. I'm glad I didn't have to explain that to the hotel. Saturday we went with a group (Gary, Corlis and Dominick Robe, Mark Linneman, Jodie Offutt, Pat Molloy, Naomi Fisher, and Debra Hisle and her husband) to the Red, Hot and Blue Barbeque specialty restaurant that Naomi recommended. The food was great. We then went back to Rubicon to an Indian Party in the con suite. Gall Walker and Jane Dennis had on Indian dresses and provided head bands with feathers for those who wanted to participate. We had a good time talking with everyone. In December Jane and Scott will be hosting a Smofcon in the same hotel.

CONFABULATION: We attended this con for Saturday only. The GoH was Mike Resnick, Filk GoH Bill Roper, and Fan GoH Grant Conan McCormick. They had one track programming, a 24-hour video room, and smoking and non-smoking consuites. We attended several programs but the one that stands out was the PREMIERE showing of Mike Resnick's video of his Africa trips. Seeing Roger Sims taking a shower in the wilds of Africa has given a new meaning to bathing. Mike will be showing this very entertaining video at RiverCon as well. We attended the banquet which was held at a local Amish restaurant serving a very fine buffet. The dinner and drink was only \$7.10. Such a deal! After dinner we stayed around for a while visiting with people and then decided we should head home. Their attendance was about 130.

Tim Bolgeo (also known as Uncle Timmy) has had several heart attacks. According to our source (Marsha McCoy), he has had two angioplasties and seems to be doing okay. The doctors are waiting to see how the angioplasty does hoping to avoid bypass surgery. All Southern Fans wish him well.
