This provision, and Bylaw 3 and the failure of any additional candidates to announce for SFC office, permits the publication of the newsletter with its absentee ballot for the business meeting of the SFC at any time after June 1 and that's when this is being produced.

The basic information on Southern Fandom Confederation is contained in the SFC Handbook, our only offset publication. This continues to be distributed to the fans whose names and addresses come to our attention from several sources. The card file, periodically typed up as a Roster was most recently amended based on the lettercols of some more fantastic comics, the newest mailing lists of the Nashville SF Club and the membership list of the latest Southern Con (Kubla Khan Toosec con report elsewhere) as well as people who wrote to us directly in response to reviews of the Bulletin or Handbook in various fanzines. Our thanks to Carol Stafford for the Nashville lists and to Dave Menrette for some Florida address deletions.

In this mailing you will receive THE supplement to Roster. #5 which you got sometime after you paid your 1973-74 dues. I hope you still have that roster because we only have 24 copies left here. All you need for a complete Somthern Fandom address listing is Roster #5 and the present Supplement. The ones in January and Bulletin 10 are obsolete and superseded.

2. Wait for them to send you your Progress reports

by third class mail

3. GRAB PROGRESS REPORT #4 and find the white 34th Worldcon Sheet - mark "NEW ORIEANS" with a 1, your other choices with 2 and 3 and mail it back with a \$3 or \$5 check made out to "1976 World Science Fiction Convention" - very important that this check not be to Discon II.

DEADLINE IS AUGUST 15...all mail mentioned above goes to Discon II, P.O. Box 31127, Washington DC 20031...hurry, hurry, kC will win if you don't (or maybe even Columbus?)

Kelly and Polly Freas (who support New Orleans in 76) Rt 4, Box 40560, Wirginia Beach VA 23457, have another poster set out! What a beauty it is, too. These are big, 12½" x 19", superly reproduced in full color at \$3 apiece or \$4.50 autographed...the set of six is \$11.95 or \$16.95 autographed. Here's the run down: CITY MACHINE (DAW No.24) shows girl fetching water from a hole cut in the ice looking wistfully at the skyscraper-city machine whose regimented warrens her people have left to live free; SINS OF THE FATHERS (Analog 11/73) presents the alien Pied Piper persuading Earthmen to follow; HERO (Analog 6/72) is a new concept of space travel using a black hole for the jump; A BRIDIE FOR PEGASUS (Apalog 7/73) is the story of a falksinger whose wild talent for stimulating the emotions of the crowd threatens the whole culture; THE BODEIAN WAY (DAW No.86) presents Margil, a romantic and lovely blue cat alien; and THE SECOND KIND OF LONELINESS (Analog space craft operator controlling a vortex which 12/72) shows the whips the interstellar vessel thru a spacewarp - he looks as if he is free floating in a colorful cosmos. These are really striking.

D. Peter Ogden, 8001 Fernview Lane, Tampa FL 33615 publishes ERBANIA with subs of 4 for \$2 and back issues 75% if ordered with a sub, otherwise \$1. He had (in March) 25-32 available and sent up #33-34, a large combo issue neatly offset, 32 pages, chock full of material on Burroughs, Tarzan, etc, artwork, movie photos and an analysis of the daily Tarzan strip 1929-72.

ETERNITY SF, editor/publisher Stephen Gregg, P.O. Box 193, Sandy Springs SC 29677, has #3 out at \$1 with 8 stories, poems and an article on SF poetry by Peter Billingham as well as a Kate Wilhelm interview, good art and a beautiful Steve Fabian cover. The South's first prozine of sf, this deserves your support (ALONG WITH NEW ORIENAS in -1976). 4 issues for \$3.50 beginning with whatever number. Authors include Discon GoH Roger Zelazny, Malzberg, Fox, Bunch, etc.

PUBLICATION UPDATES (continued):

RIVERSIDE QUARTERLY (latest issue Vol.6, No.1, 60¢) is \$2 for 4 issues and for a \$6 sub you get a Lovecraft symposium pamphlet. This now emanates from the South )(previously Canada) namely, editor Leland Sapiro, Box 14451, University Sta., Gainesville FL 32604. This is one of the prestigious and scholarly journals of sf criticism and commentary. Heinlein in Dimension by Panshin, for example, now an Advent book, originally appeared in these pages.

Peter Veters, 2819 Fenelon St., Chalmette IA 70043 announces a Star Trek newsletter, Beyond Antares, for 17¢ a copy, 65¢ for a sub of 5. It is monthly and contains ads, articles, con info and current ST news. The fanzine of the same name was announced as 70 pages with sf and ST stories and artwork for 75c by mail or 50c in person.

Richard Garrison, fan pubber of note, has brought his operation south. HERITAGE, P.O. Box 721, Forest Park GA 30050 has numerous pubs and posters, which will doubtless be huxtered at DeepSkuthCon and are available by mail. He will be publishing the Brooks/Beahm Vaugn Bode index in the near future.

Fantasy artist, ex-Atlantan BB Sams, writes to say that he is now married and a Walt Disney artist/cartoonist for ads and merchandise. He'll be having some gag cartoons pubbed in <u>Cavalier</u> soon and is interested in assignments of fantasy cover art for the paying fanzine markets such as...

Rick Sneary is hardly a Southern (SOUTH Gate, CA) fan but wrote on March 26: "I have just read (Perry) Chapdelaine's review of SFC HAND-BOOK in Mike Glyer's fanzine, and I want a copy. I want it bad enough to enclose a check for that amount. While for various reasons beyond my control, I am having to give up most of my fanac, I still want to maintain contacts and some idea of what has happened. I'm not sure I know what has been happening in the South these last few years. I will be particulably interested in getting straight the dates and locations of different cons. For the past three years I've been trying to assemble a card file reference on all cons, awards and special events, and officers where possible. Only when you try to gather yhis kind of information in, do you realize how hard it is. Even LOCUS didn't cover everything...I'm sure Perry was right, that it was a lot of work but there is cold comfort that your Handbook will be still being read and used, long after the current fanzines are mere legions [sic]. Congratulations in advance."

About midday Friday, May 10, Meade & Penny Frierson and "chillhuns" managed to make our first outing, that being to the con suite in the Nashville TN I-24/Harding Place Holiday Inn (Room 202 for posterity) and encountered, outside it, KEN MOORE & JOHN HOLLIS (our fearless leaders) and RON MILIER, then within GARY STEELE, GEORGE WELLS and MEMORY FRECLUDES me from an exhausting list of 10 earlybirds. Registration was being competently handled by CAROL STAFFORD, Sec of the con, or GINGER KADERABEK. The first order of business, however, was the second Annual Gerst House Beer Bash and since Wells was the only vet there (the Greenfields not having as yet arrived from we persuaded him to accompany us. Going on instinct (mapless) and four new tires, we managed to find the place and while I stocked up on liquor next door, acquiring such exotics as Creme de Banana and Ouzo as well as some Maker's Mark for andy offutt and Evan Williams which Bob Tucker pronounced to be "s-m-o-a-t-h...", the rest ordered Bavarian Pizza, &c and huge bowls of draft Lowenbrau. The pleasant repast over, with George bemoaning how he would not be able to remember the rest of the con, we found a farmer's-market-type place which promised not to bilk us on bheer prices and stocked up on such exotics as Blatz, Griesedieck Malt Liquor and other obscurities. [Woals to Newcastle the conCom kept the bathtub stocked continuously with non-obscurities]

Upon our return we encountered a Memphis trio in search of food, GREG BRIDGES, JIM HARRIS and JOHN WILLIAMSON and visited with them awhile, introducing them to Eric Sean whom they'd missed at DSC '73 and playing hot potato with his rubber frog. Then, down to see who was set up in the Huxter's Room: here was RICHARD GARRISON with his Heritage Press offerings, RUSTY HEVELIN who was in charge of huxtering, ALIAN WILDE from K.C. with an assortment of goodies, DENVER SHERRY (who byought a vopy of HPL - my only sale, I didn't do much huxtering myself) and Jim Harris. Jim had been liquidating his collection and we aided him, hauling large quantities of low priced goodies back to the room intermittently. JACK CHALKER arrived later with his excellent Mirage Press publications, which dented the budget again. We managed to pass some pleasant moments getting to know the KC people and others who passed in and out of the huxter rooms. Things were by then underway in the con suite and we passed the time with ALIEN & BARBARA GREENFIELD, GEO-RGE ORENTLICHER and SAM GASTFRIEND (the Agacon 74 co-chairman), who had come in from Atlanta in a microbus, and JOE CELKO (other co-chairman) and STEVE & BINKER HUGHES who arrived from there otherwise. Then there was another Atlanta contingent composed of MIKE WEBER and SCA persons IDA HUTCHINGS, REBECCA LE DOCK, "STARHELM" WARLOCKE and probab ly more. I recall, but dimly - much bheer was consumed) late in the early morning of Saturday discussing all manner of fascinating things with Chalker. Below us, the films rolled on - I, Mudd; King Kong; my Ernie Kovacs special. ABBIE COIDSMITH and kid were there. Birminghamians WADE GILBREATH and FRANK LOVE showed up. The ill-fated Northern train contingent, BOB TUCK, LIZ GROSS, ANN & BOB PASSAVOY, wh se train had mugged a town called Cemore or Seymour, arrived, the worse for wear. Separately travelling northerners fared better - DICK TATGE with a fine supply of art and songs, PHYLLIS EISENSTEIN (more on her singing later), the GoH GORDY DIGKSON and ANN CASS, to group the singers, who were duly aided by local BRANDY BRANDON.

We stopped by POLLY & KELLY FREAS' room to preview some of his prelims (and bought two beauties) and thenwith Kelly went on down to see Ron Miller's fabulous astronomical scenes. I consulted with ERIC JAMBORSKY

who, with IARRY WOIFE, was in charge of films concerning the problems which the Tuscaloosa fans had encountered in trying to screen my copy of <u>Dr. Strangelove</u> and Eric thought the job could be done (it was, Sunday morning). I met with a lot of old friends that night, JOE & NITA GREEN who introduced me to T.B. SWANN, JOE SICIARI, CLIFF & VARY AMOS, RALPH MOSS and other Louisvilleans down to promote Rivercon '75 there, locals DAN WALDWELL, STEVE BLCCH, and DICM STAFFORD (in disguise, a heavy beard he didn't have when we visited in December). I briefly met DAN HENDERSON from Memphis who has started selling sf stories.

Sometime in the wee smalls, a breakfast caravan was launched. I managed four wrong turns when there were only two possibilities and a Steak & Eggs place was our vittim. Judging from the stuff I was eating while lecturing on a supercomplex drinking game I'd just learned I realize that I was drunk and it would be a good time to call it a night around dawn.

It was noonish when we stumbled, subdued, into the con area again to see the artshow being set up, obtain coffee and donuts, and await the panel of writers: andy offutt, Phyllis Eisenstein, Joe Green, Gordy Dickson, DON WOLLHEIM, GREG WILLIAMS, CHARLES FONTENAY, and PERRY CHAP DELAINE. The reticient TB Swann demurred, which was a shame. The feature started a little late but was well worth the wait since I found the discussion stimulating (which was what I needed, in my condition) and after it, while waiting for the artists panel, I met BRIAN HAMPTON from England who had been only briefly met the night before advocating a London Convention for 1979. Brian and I chatted for a while during the artists' panel and become so involved that I ended up missing that one (perhaps a fanzine will report). Erwin Strauss was soon involved with us on the British interstellar probe design and since I was deficient in speculative physics, I called in ""my" expert on matters interstellar, Frank Love. Our seminar mext moved to a discussion of con sizes and activities and matters more fannish than technical and suddently it was time for the Khanglomerate Film Festival composed of real gems like Superman cartoons from the 1940s, Crusader Rabbit and trailers and miscellaney.

At the Banquet that eve, the Greenfeelds kindly saved us a seat next to JIM TILLMAN. There was plenty of food and we enjoyed the program. Ken Moore non-introduced andy offutt, who got a well wrapped can of Coors bheer, after Carol Stafford recited a very Service-able ode to the first KKC. Then Bob Passavoy entertained us with his funny version of the trip south, presenting Ken with a bent railroad spike as a token of luring them into that tragedy. Ken handed out some Galactic Eggs as tributes to the guests and gave Dan Caldwell a booby prize which was in process of disintegrating when Dan showed it to us on the way out. Gordy Dickson spoke knowledgeably and thoughtfully on the subject of the developing influence on sf in the 1970s - movies and tv. He felt that trufans could help shape the increasing involvement of the good sf writers in those fields. Jack Chalker then gave us the scoop on the Hugo nominees (prior to anyone's receipt of LOCUS 159).

There was milling around in the con suite when the first auction was going on below, Jack Chalker and Bob Passavoy presiding. The KC folks were holding open house next to the con suite with Bob Tucker teaching people wow to drink bourbon; Larry Propp and I got a chance to

compare lawyer notes; JIM CORRICK, GIENDA SANDERS, andy and I talked about the Tennessee 'clave tradition in which we'd all been involved since IRVIN KCCH started them in '70, and about Jim's poem, The Spaciad, a tribute to offutt which is to appear in HUTTLOXOPETL 9, my legendary (from waiting for its appearance) genzine, due realsoonnow. I saw mf favorite portions of 2001, which ran quite late. There was a party in 215 with IVAN SHEWMAKE, JOE HAMMOND and others. Quite a bit of info was flying about on the 7-in-77 bidding committee's interest in a southern con site for '77(mandatory if New Orlenas should happen to lose!!) Larry Wolfe had a very late night party.

Sunday morning I was lured awake by the first opportunity to see my copy of Dr Strangelove. We had family commitments in the town of my birth so had to miss the SCA presentation and final auction. We did play, a minor sensation, Joe Moudry's bootleg Zappa album cut, The Cool Green Hills of Earth, as Kelly sketched the Atlanta SCAns. On returning Witchaft Through the Ages was playing (a silent). There were a host of left-overs, and left over bheer to match, and the con-weary evening grew gradually more boisterous, what with Ken Moore bodypainting classes (he was zonked out at the time), a seminar on what Watership Bown rabbit jokes would be like (space prevents the reprinting of the longer apa con report containing them). Geogre Wells had played Messenger Boy for Emshwiller and had some lovely cover painting which we saw. Did Imention the DENNIS DOTSON and HARRY WHITVER work which was also on display and for sale? Ken Moore is a sf art nut and set a very high tone for that aspect of the con.

Up in the Freen's room, 328 for the record, an excellent song session was in progress. We heard the part where Phyllis Eisenstein was teaching Gordy Dickson some Israeli songs; all sang old favorites, Dick Tatge composed one (to "Davy Crockett") for andy offutt and the con rolled on, past our sleeping forms by 3 am.

We finally let the kids do a little swimming Monday along with the offuttspring and said goodbye at poolside to the offutts, Abby Goldsmith, Brian Hampton, Greenfields and Atlantans and made it back to Birmingham to try to remember and set down notes which made the basis for "Fandom is a Joke Told by a Rabbit Full of Therry Brandy and Coke, Signifying a Lot of Fun", Countdown to Washington Press pub pages 376-383 which went to some of you and the apas, as I've mentioned.

Just enough room for one of the rabbit jokes we decided upon in executive committee that Sunday night: There were three rabits who decided they would find out which of them could stand to be dirty for the longest time. They went to a farmer and asked if they could go into his pigysty, and he let themm. Four hours later one of the Rabbits came thum ing at the farmhouse door and asked to be allowed to take a bath. Two hours after that a second rabbit came in for a shower. Two hours later than that, the third rabbit came in to clean up. Twelve hours later, a fourth rabbit was thumping at the door.

Okay, one more: What do you call a forrest full of foxes? Uninrabbitable.

Then there were jokes which are currently popular in Poland, like how many Americans does it take to wind a watch? One.

Just remember: Cons may be strange, but fans are stranger.
