Chattacon 3 had an unexpected 321 attending for AE Van Vogt, videotapes, banquet, substitute MC Perry Chapdelaine and a full huckster room. The Committee is gearing up with more features for next year.

Roc\*Kon 2 in Feb. 1978 had Bob Tucker and Bob Asprin entertaining 150 or more in Little Rock (where are my notes?)

CoastCon in March was in Biloxi MS with Freff, George Alec Effinger, Cliff & Susan Biggers. About 200 came including New Orleans "old hands" and many newcomers. Panels, readings, and wargaming were the events of the March con. Joe Haldeman was also there, reading from his new ST novel.

Mixed reviews emerged from Orangecon in Orlando in March where Andre Norton showed up and a new set of awards were named for her. ST and sf films were the emphasis. No accurate figures.

Kubla Khan Sex was in <sup>N</sup>ashville in May with Ted Sturgeon, andy offutt (a/k/a John Cleve), Vincent DiFate, and many program items which had snafu'd at earlier times. Plenty of writers too and a masquerade. Attendance was under 300. Louisville fans were good sports since it was Derbyday back home and brought their southern hospitality in the form of mint juleps for the Derbywatching (and betting).

Nutriacon in May in New Orleans had about 150 attend. George Alec Effinger and Don Markstein were guests of honor.

June 2-4 were the dates of the sprawling, biggest DeepSouthCon ever chaired by Rich Garrison and Ginger Kaderabek. Registration was 720. Jack Williamson substituted for Clifford Simak as GoH and read the opening to his Humanoids sequel at the banquet. Joe Haldeman subbed for Robert Meinlein at the blood drive, to the donors of which Kelly Freas also contributed his famous caricatures. The drive was highly successful. The professional attendance was most impressive: R.A. Lafferty, Joe Haldeman, Jack Williamson, Charles Grant, Karl Wagner, Gerald Page, Vincent DiFate, Kelly Freas, Ron Miller, Joe Green, andy offutt, Michael Bishop, Peg Campbell, Sharon Jarvis, andy porter (of Algol), George Scithers (of IASFM), artists Whelan, Wrightson, Jones, Rpger Dean and Michael Goodwin. The artshow included 11 Chesley Bonestells, 24 Freases, and much more. The banquet was attended by 265 and saw awarding of the Rebel to Don Markstein and the Phoenix to Karl Edward Wagner and a special well-deserved award to Kelly and Polly Freas "who can do anything". Numerous art awards were given as well. The auction far exceeded any DSC record and matched the best of the regionals. As one who attended the biggest worldcon to date (Washington in 1974), I was struck by the similarities to this, the biggest DSC to date. One walked oneself to exhaustion, but...great fun!!

Later in June Atlanta was the site of a ST con run out of NYC which featured limited appearances by the ST stars as promised, lots of ST films and poorly attended (because largely unannounced) events. About 1000 attended -small for an ST affair, which measures the gross in dollars, not people, imho.

Rivercon IV featured GoH Robert Bloch, Toastmaster Bob Tucker and Fan GoH Ned Brooks in a luxury motel in Louisville in July. The con was large, but one didn't get lost. The hospitality suite was the best yet; Larry Niven showed up a year late; The masquerade was well-attended and good (Penny and I were among the judges). A world premiere of a movie took place, and The Time Warp was the dance of the day. John Harris ran a successful blood drive, a noble aspect of modern sf cons.

Unreported are the Vul-Con V, August 11-13, 1978 in New Orleans and Atlanta Comics and Fantasy Fair the same time in Atlanta with comics emphasis(whereas the former had ST emphasis).

Unless someone comes up with a Halfacon, the south's traditional cons' season is at an end, except for Page 1, Col. 2 events.

Supplemental fannish thoughts on the foregoing - Guy Lillian must be recorded as winner of the 1978 DSC hearts championship. Kudos are due Hank Reinhardt and George Wells for their dual of the worst sf novels ever. And, incidentally, galley proof copies of Battlestar Galactica were given away. Virginia Aalko from FL is to be thanked for the handsmme awards distributed at DSC.


