Your receipt of this Bulletin presupposes that you already have or had a copy of the 16 page tabloid SOUTHERN FANDOM CONFEDERATION HANDBOOK (from mid-1977) which tells you what the SFC is all about and gives some interesting history of fandom in SFC-land. Readers of the Bulletin have noted that some entries in past issues have been slightly incomprehensible (in addition to microelite type) because they didn't learn the terminology of the field from the HANDBOOK first. I have no answer to that.

IF YOU WILL KINDLY CHECK THE NETHER PAGES, you will find out whether you are considered dues-paid or dues-exempt for the present fiscal year of the SFC - August 1979 to August 1980. If your name is absent from the listing, we would appreciate \$1.00 dues so that you can be sure of receiving Bulletin 23 in Spring, 1980, the pre-DSC newsletter in summer, 1980, and of course Roster of names and addresses #8 and its supplements.

The SFC business meeting in New Orleans, July 22, 1979, approved an increase in dues to \$2 per year effective Aug. 80 to Aug. 81. This was conditioned on the creation of a new comprehensive handbook as of mid-June, 1980. All clubs are encouraged to submit their logos in black and white for reproduction in the Handbook. Please don't pay dues in advance - the extra money ends up as a contribution and makes you a patron but we still ask for dues when the time comes.

A new copy of the HANDBOOK costs 40¢ third class mail, but we try to maintain a supply through local clubs, so please check there first.

SOUTHERN CONVENTIONS OF RECENT PAST

Stellarcon IV, April 6-8, 1979, drew 200 mainly from N.C. to interact with David Gerrold, Ted Sturgeon and M.A. Foster as well as attend a strong film program. Jim Gilpatrick, roving reporter for Anvil, the Birmingham clubzine, noted that a successful sf con can be held without parties, booze, hucksters when sponsored on campus. The SF3 is the Greensboro NC club which will continue to sponsor such spring gatherings according to Judith Low (POB 13222, Greensboro NC 27405)

Kubla Khanception, May 18-20, 1979, featured Frank Robinson, Bob Tucker, Jack Chalker, Andrew Offutt, Michael Whelan, Vincent DiFate, and other professionals surrounded by about 250 midwest & southern fans in Nashville's annual party at the Quality (sic) Inn. As your editor missed the con, the sentiment has been often expressed: "missed a good one."

Just Imagicon, May 25-27, 1979, presented GoH L. Sprague DeCamp, Fan GoH Lon Atkins, artist Kelly Freas, and writers Bob Asprin, Grant Carrington, Jerry Page to over 300 in Memphis over the Cotton Festival weekend. Numerous special features were attempted (including no smoking anywhere), films and video shows were ample and Ted Sturgeon was ever charming as with the two foregoing cons. The con was, however, mismanaged and lost money.

DeepSouthCon '79 was the 17th annual rotating DSC, this year sponsored by the Sons of the Sand Ltd in New Orleans July 20-22, 1979. R.A. Lafferty was honored as GoH and in an awards ceremony the Rebel was at long last presented to Cliff Amos, leader of FOSFA, Rivercon and the 1979 NorthAmeriCon(below). The Phoenix was presented to Jo Clayton. Guy Lillian created a special chapbook to honor Lafferty. Attendance was over 400. 3rd largest DSC!

The Atlanta Comics & Fantasy Fair was held in Atlanta GA July 27-29, 1979 with several noted graphic artists. No report to date.

Vul-con VI was held in New Orleans August 10-12, 1979 with guest J.J. Saunders of Salvage I, films, hucksters and such but no reports to date.

Rovacon IV held in Roanoke VA September 28-29 presnted David Gerrold, Karl Edward Wagner, and Kelly Freas. No report to date.

Two thousand fans gathered at the Galt House hotel in Louisville KY over Labor Day weekend to attend the NorthAmeriCon, billed as a world science fiction convention without Hugos or British accents. Without a doubt the scope of the con was far greater than anything previously run by southern fans. Cliff Amos, shadowed by Beth Pointer, was a markedly omnipresent and accessible con chair. Ken Amos headed operations by day and Morris Middleton, by night - Sue Francis kept registration running smoothly. Bernie Willinger ran the masquerade. In fact, it looked like Louisville fans and a few from Nashville and elsewhere bore the brunt of the hard work necessary to keep such a function on track. The problems seemed to center about the dimness and rules of the art show, the 35mm projectors (which after valiant efforts by Mike Hutto & Co. had to be abandoned in favor of a 16mm film program), and (unjustified in my view) the lack of a hospitality suite. Bob Roehm kept an interesting formal program on schedule as did Tom Wallbank with the video room (24 hours!). Dick and Nicki Lynch put out the daily newzine, the Nebula, which announced the parties, program changes and newsbits...topped by Charlie Williams' eye-catching logos. Special events deserve special mention - Irvin Koch arranged for specialty groups to meet and kept the NJF room open 24 hours.

The SFC was allotted three hours (took four) to distribute material, gather news and dues on Saturday morning. We discovered at least three new clubs! Details hereafter.

Although the formal program did not start until Thursday, fans started collecting at the hotel on Monday. Harry Andruschak of L.A. and a handful of others were that early and held the early puppy (as opposed to dead dog) parties. By Wednesday I was able to create some news by having the lock on our bathroom door break. Cigarettes were rolled under the door to me as the bellman, security man and finally (90 minutes in prison) the maintenance man was called back in at midnight to ream out the lock and free me.

Filksingers were in high voice and nicely provided for - guitars in one function room, piano in another, and a cappella (sp?) on the lobby stairs. There were in fact two lobbies to serve as a gathering spot (with more air than a con suite).

Events of note were the well-attended masquerade with many fine costumes but the favorite being a skit by the Resnicks and friends of the 1938 Henry Kuttner story. Two world premieres were held at a neighborhood theatre, H.G. Wells' Shape of Things to Come and An Arabian Adventure. Before the 35mm failed, there were Winds of Change and Lord of the Rings. Many more fascinating films were on hand but unavailable for view. The videotapers were plentiful and did their own thing all weekend. The formal program included panels with Aussiefan Mervyn Binns, George Scithers, Forrest J. Ackerman, Marta Randall, Jo Clayton, Bob Asprin, Charles Grant, Jack Chalker, A Bertram Chandler, Gordy Dickson, Jim Baen, Gale Burnick, Jack Williamson, Lester DelRey, Fred Pohl (GoH); there were readings by Howard Waldrop, George R.R. Martin, Edward Bryant, and Karl Edward Wagner. Andrew J. Offutt was on several panels and visible at parties. Indeed for the autograph collectors and would-be writers the con was a cherished opportunity with so many authors and editors in attendance. The topics were diverse and entertaining by all reports. The con was capped by a nighttime riverboat ride. For the aquatically inclined the pool provided relaxation (and, later, spectator sport).

Just as it was early to start, the con was slow to die - the dead dog parties were as packed as any Saturday night at most regional cons, I'm sure there was activity yet on Tuesday but we left.

The hotel adjoined an area called the Belvedere which hosted an international festival the same weekend and provided an extra set of features such as non-hotel food, dancing and all types of music. I strolled out during the masquerade judging with Joe Celko to look over the back of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra playing "The Anvil Chorus" just below the second story balcony. While there were many hucksters, there seemed to be too many offering new books and too few offering comics. The con received pretty good press.

I've enjoyed weekend cons and I've enjoyed the few worldcons I've been able to attend - 1971, 1974 and 1976 - but NAC will rank extraordinarily high in my feelings for years to come, I'm sure. The highest commendations to all who toiled so diligently so that the rest of us could have such a memorable time!! And I hope the con will receive more cogent and comprehensive reviews in the fanzines (ma ybe Andy Porter will cover it in his new SF CHRONICLE which premiered at NAC).

Nightshade 5 (\$2, trade or published LoC from Ken Amos, c/o 7005 Bedford Lane, Louisville KY 40222) is a fanzine about fantasy, 32 pp beautifully printed, long article on David Lindsay, Bob Roehm's Ballantine Adult Fantasy checklist, book and fantasy fanzine reviews, attractive artwork and letters.

Panzine 4 from Robert Teague, 1900 Clay av, Panama City FL 32405 presents a Marion Ross portfolio, another installment of Jon Pryor fiction, cartoons by Bob, etc.

After a long absence from these pages, Allan Beatty's Photron emerges in Absentia from PO Box 1040, Ames IA 50010 as a 40pp 5½x8 booklet with a wide variety of fan writers represented. 75¢ or The Usual.

Slower Than Infinity 5 (available for the Usual from Clint Hyde, 420 E. Roanoke St., Blacksburg VA 24060 -unless a CoA is at the back of this Bulletin). This issue is written in the form of a diary of fannish events in his life (or at least three months). Very interesting I thought.

David Pettus, Rt.2, Box 274-B, Loretto TN 38469 plans a new fanzine, Fan Plus, for January 1980. 8½ x 11 magazine type, off-set. He has graciously consented to carry a regular column on southern fandom.

Greg Bridges reports that Tom Johnson is preparing the third issue of Fantasy Film Journal, the first having been reprinted & the first two issues are still available from Tom, 200 So. Cox, Memphis TN 38118. Greg also tells us that Guy Townsend who publishes Mystery Fancier has moved to Blytheville AR and is interested in publishing some articles on sf in mysteries. (Unfortunately, we have no current address on Guy.)

A one-shot by Margaret Middleton and Nancy Collins announces the unity of "cheap mimeo fandom" (anyone paying less than \$151 qualifies). Both had been hyperactive in con-going of late and vow to convert these energies (and funds, one presumes) to creation of more fanzines. Margaret already has Runway 37 (see below) and Kantéle (presumably about filksinging) and Nancy announces Razed Consciousness, "a bizarre zine with traces of softcore at its edges", Bamfi, and Dead Parrot, "a underground rag for my alma mater, ASU".

BUSINESS TIME...

The SFC Business meeting was held at the DSC under the direction of P.L. Caruthers, acting Pres., with minutes by Ed Guelnder. Elections were Meade Frierson, President, Susan Biggers, Secretary and Cliff Biggers, First Delegate. By a slim vote (including the mail ballot) of 28-16, Oklahoma was admitted to the SFC by a by-law. Whatever the estimable Okies may have had in mind by the application, it is inapplicable to carry their local fen on the roster or try to distribute the material out there other than a bulk mailing to Okon or the Tulsa fans. The charter of SFC-land takes a great effort to amend and 28-16 ain't no kind of great effort. Without considerable support from CK, we'll take the by-law with a grain of salt and be friendly as usual, but....

The increase of dues to \$2 with stipulation of a new Handbook was passed as has been mentioned before. (MORE ON PAGE 6)

Shelby Bush, a permanent patron of SFC, has some points for discussion and consideration. His first point is that the SFC needs a Vice President for such occasions as DSC 17 when I was unable to preside over the Business Meeting. Also, the title would serve to honor a well-known fan, one capable of being plugged into the news network and really help in gathering information for the SFC. This seems a worthy matter - nominations and a vote on new by-law 10 must reach me by June 1. Remember 10 signatures of SFC members are needed by Bylaw 3 (p.15 of the Handbook).

Mr. Bush also suggests an official SFC flag "which would be flown at DSC (if not from a hotel flagpole, at least at the SFC meeting)". He suggests the lower portion of the SFC patch, i.e. the Confederate Battle flag with sword and rocket. Any sewing types out there volunteer?

Third, he says we should allocate funds to a one-page flier, explaining the basics about SFC with directions on how to join. We have never before done exactly this. When "stale names" on the list become suspect, we usually send out a 10¢ postcard warning they will be dropped without show of interest or dues but never sent a real pitch to prospects, usually the full materials (less roster reserved for members only). Since Shelby's program books and Louisville printers have done such a good job in the past, I appoint him and FOSFA as a committee to prepare a "master" of such a flyer, at least in time for Aggiecon in March because they have expressed interest in SFC.

If a group of people wants to join from outside the area, perhaps we should officially sanction SFC Outposts. They could, like Tulsa be recognized as southerners-at-heart or whatever.

Mr. Bush likewise encourages other clubs to follow FOSFA's example namely to allocate a portion of club dues to assure SFC membership for all club members.

Finally, he wonders about so many dues-exempt people. Pros, he says, are certainly justified but fanzine publishers and club presidents are questioned. I feel strongly about these two groups because the effort they put out in furthering fandom hereabouts is certainly worth other member's paying for their free material.
