Vice-President Bio

Regina Kirby was elected as the Vice President of the Southern Fandom Confederation at DSC60. Her first convention was the now defunct Dixie Trek in 1988. She has won both the 2005 Georgia Fandom Award (later renamed the Hank Reinhardt Fandom Award) and the 2013 Rebel award, both considered lifetime achievement awards for service to fandom. She is a former Chair of Chattacon and currently serves as the Events Division Head and director of Programming. She holds the role of Guest Services Director at ConJuration. She is also an advisor to the Chair, Guest Liaison, and Assistant Consuite director at LibertyCon. She also volunteers at several other conventions.

She is probably best known as the Senior Director of Programming for Dragon Con. She wears a lot of hats. She jokes that she doesn't have children, she has conventions. There is more than a little truth to that statement.

CONVENTION REPORTS

DeepSouthCon 60

When I received my e-mail confirmation from the Huntsville Embassy Suites, it said that check-in time was 4 PM. I decided that 1 PM would be the right time to leave Nashville, and that is about the time that my wife Anita and I got in our car and began our drive. We were making good time on I-65 until we reached the first exit for Columbia, Tennessee and found that there was road construction that closed one lane. It then took us 1.5 hours to travel about 10 miles. After clearing the construction, we stopped in Pulaski, Tennessee, to top off the gas tank, take a bathroom break, and get a quick snack. We continued on I-65 until we reached I-565 which would take us to downtown Huntsville. Then we found ourselves in yet another traffic jam caused by an accident that delayed us another half hour. It was after sunset when we made it to the hotel. I was getting a little nervous, because my eye doctor has advised me against driving at night.

The Embassy Suites serves complimentary drinks from 5:30 to 7 PM, and we had about 20 minutes left when we finally got checked in, so we bypassed going to our room and took our luggage directly to the bar. We found chairs at same table as Steve and Sue Francis and Richard and Lois Wellinghurst and had enough time for a glass of wine and for some complimentary hors'deuvres. Richard then ordered pizza for the group and graciously invited us to join them. While we were waiting, I meandered over to registration and picked up our badges. Then we finally proceeded to our room to drop off our luggage. From there we found the con suite, which had an ample supply of snacks, and visited with Gary and Corliss Robe and Rich Dengrove. We did not make it to the Libertycon party until it was closing, so we called it a night.

We were up in time Saturday to take advantage of the complimentary hot breakfast. After a brief pass through the art show and dealers room, we attended the "Kandyklatsche" with Greg Benford. (Instead of coffee, they served fudge and Rice Krispie treats.) There was good attendance, including Guy and Rose-Marie Lillian, Rich and Nikki Lynch, Pat Gibbs, Patrick Molloy, and Naomi Fisher. (My apologies if I missed anyone.) Greg talked about a variety of subjects, including a fundamental scientific error in Neal Stephenson's *Seveneves* and scientific problems with N.K. Jemison's *Broken Earth* trilogy and the film *Gravity*.

Our next programming item was a memorial for the late Samanda B. Jeude for which the panellists were Sam Smith and

Guy Lillian. Guy talked about the malicious attack by Ted White upon her when she stood for TAFF, and I was able to help with a few details. Sue Francis told a story about racing scooters with Samanda, and others shared their remembrances and observations about her achievements in getting access to conventions for handicapped persons. Mike Kennedy, who is now confined to a wheelchair, discussed the challenges handicapped persons are still having at conventions. It was a very nice discussion.

The guest of honor speeches and awards presentations came next, in which the guests (Jody Lynn Nye, Norman Cates, Sam Kennedy, and Bill Plott) all gave nice speeches. Gary Robe gave the Rubble Award to the Covid-19, and the Phoenix Award went to David Coe and the late Eric Flint. The Rebel went to Brandy Bolgeo Hendren, the first second generation Rebel winner, her father Tim "Uncle Timmy" having won in 1999.

The speeches went over their time slot so Anita and I only had time for one glass of wine each during the cocktail hour. We then had a nice dinner in the con suite, where they served pork barbecue, baked beans, and cheese cake. We finished off the night at the Contraflow party, where I saw my old friends Michael Scott, one of my oldest friends in fandom, Jessica Styons, whom I have known since she was a teenager, and Rebecca Smith, whom I have known for about 30 years. They served Louisiana beers, of which I enjoyed a strawberry flavoured Abita, and Louisiana hors'deuvres.

We were a little late getting up Sunday morning, so while we were able to eat the complimentary breakfast, we missed the Southern Fandom Confederation business meeting. We did make the DeepSouthCon business meeting, which actually had a contested bid for 2024. Gary Robe proposed Concave in Bowling Green, Kentucky, and Jennifer Liang the Unocoi State Park and Lodge in Helen, Georgia. Jennifer won by a decisive 13 to 10 vote.

We left shortly afterward, and, in conclusion, I would say that this DeepSouthCon really felt like a family or class reunion. With few exceptions, we had not seen these people since before the pandemic. Our drive home was not without incident, unfortunately. We ran into road construction on I-565, which delayed us about half an hour, and passed the remains of a car accident, also on I-565. It was a relief to get home

SFC By-Laws As of 2023

SECTION 1 (a) The Southern Fandom Confederation is a non-profit organization of, by, and for science fiction and fantasy fans residing in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia; existing for the purpose of promoting fan and professional activity within that area. *The SFC has been and always shall be a non-discriminatory organization*. (b) The President shall have the discretion to name as "Southern Sympathizers" persons or groups outside the South for the purpose of membership and participation in the SFC.

SECTION 2. The SFC shall meet once a year, simultaneously and at the same place as the DeepSouthCon, hereafter DSC. In the event a DSC is not held in a given year, the SFC officers may agree on a time and place for the annual meeting, preferably at an alternate southern convention, and will announce that information to the membership in a timely manner. This meeting shall be open to all dues-paid and dues-exempt SFC members, plus interested parties. Only Dues-paid or exempt members may speak or vote except through dispensation by the presiding officer. Each meeting shall consist of: (a) a review of the year's activity, (b) election of officers, and (c) suggestions from the membership for activities in the year ahead.

SECTION 3. The officers of the SFC shall consist of (a) President, (b) Vice President, (c) Secretary, and (d) Treasurer. All officers of the SFC must reside within the Confederacy. All are elected to one-year terms of office.

Other than the President, any two (2) offices may be combined for one year at the option of the membership present and voting at the meeting at which officers are elected. Without specifically voting to combine two offices, the membership may effectively accomplish the same result by electing the same person to two offices; however, no person shall be allowed to be elected as President if already elected to serve in another office during the same or overlapping term(s) of office and no person elected as President shall be allowed to be elected to serve in another office during the same or overlapping term(s) of office.

- (a) The President shall run the annual SFC business meeting, present a summary of the year's activities, set SFC policy on matters of controversy, publish the official SFC bulletin on a tri-annual basis, and represent the SFC at all fannish functions.
- (b) The Vice President shall serve in the place of the President should the President be absent. The Vice President shall also assist the President in special projects and other duties as requested by the President within reason.
- (c) The secretary of the SFC, in conjunction with the other officers, shall maintain a file of all active Southern fans, clubs, amateur press alliances, conventions, and related fannish enterprises (including those available only electronically) and shall work to disseminate information about these persons, publications, organizations, and events to interested parties, especially members of the SFC. The Secretary shall also maintain the minutes,

records, and other documents of the SFC created and/or used during the Secretary's term of office, and shall turn over said minutes, records, and other documents to the Archivist upon completion of the Secretary's term of office. The Secretary shall take minutes of the SFC Business meeting and the DSC Business Meeting held at DeepSouthCon during her or his term of office and shall prepare a report of same to be submitted to the president for publication in the Bulletin. The Secretary shall also assist the President and the Vice President upon request within reason. In the event of the absence of the President and the Vice President, the Secretary shall preside.

(d) The Treasurer shall collect dues for the SFC and maintain an account at a convenient bank on which only the Treasurer or the President may draw. The Treasurer is responsible for mailing the official Bulletin at the cheapest possible rate. The Treasurer shall also assist the other officers at request within reason. In the absence of all other officers, the Treasurer shall preside.

SECTION 4. Dues for the SFC are \$15.00 per year for an individual, with institutional dues being \$50.00 per year, a year being defined as the period between successive DeepSouthCons. Payment of institutional dues also entitles the organization so paying to one free advertisement in the SFC bulletin. The following are dues-exempt: (a) Winners of the Rebel and Phoenix Awards presented at the DSC, (b) Individuals who have performed such service to the organization that the President feels they merit exemption, (c) SFC officers during their term of service.

SECTION 5. The official SFC Bulletin shall be published at least every four months. The contents of each issue shall be left to the discretion of the President/editor, but shall include the following: one issue each year shall include a comprehensive list of Southern SF clubs, apas, fanzines, and/or dues-paid and -exempt SFC members. Other material in the bulletin shall be concerned with Southern fandom's history, present activity & future plans.

Editorial policy: (a) The bulletin shall concern itself freely with controversial matters confronting Southern Fandom. All editorial opinions shall be signed by the author and shall not be considered reflective of the

opinions of any officer of the SFC itself. (b) The bulletin shall maintain a neutral position between and among competing bids for DSC, or between and among Southern contenders for a Worldcon. (c) A letter column shall be printed in each issue containing a comprehensive spectrum of opinion on any matter before the SFC. (d) The SFC shall promote the candidacy of Southern fans and professionals for fAndOm-wide honors such as the Hugo Award. (Capitalization courtesy Guy Lillian, as reported by Tim Gatewood, SFC Secretary.)

SECTION 6. This set of by-laws may be amended or replaced by the SFC members in attendance at the DSC meeting. Any amendment proposed in writing and signed by 20 or more SFC members must be brought before this meeting and voted upon. A majority of members at the meeting may cause an amendment to be brought to a vote. A 2/3 majority of members voting shall be sufficient to cause an amendment to pass.


