As for the rest of the zine, they may not all be legal, but in order to check I'd have to read them all and there just isn't the time. Maybe I'll do that for the next mailing.

MEMBERSHIP: Limited to 30 members. Couples may share dual membership, with separate activity/credit requirements and voting rights. One set of dues and mailings.

ACTIVITY: Each member must furnish 6 or more pages of original material (prior circulation will not count toward the members needed page requirements) in any period of two consecutive mailings. 5 of the 6 pages are to be the members own work, and at least 3 pages his own writing. One page of art work by someone else will count as your own work (a cover, for example). 35 legible, identical copies are required. The deadlines are quarterly. The 15th of January, April, July and October. UNLESS the OE says differently.

Postmailings or premailed zines will not be counted as creditable pages.

A NEW MEMBER must have at least 6 pages in his/her first mailing.

DUES: \$2 per year, payable before the deadline of your last paid-up mailing, as listed next to your name on the roster. The OE may make special assessments if necessary, or grant free dues when the treasury allows.

WAITING LIST: When no openings exist on the roster, applicants will be placed on the waiting list. They must pay a \$1 fee to be placed on the list. The \$1 applies on the first years dues, but is not refunded to drop-offs. Waiting listers receive the SPECTATOR quarterly, and must respond to each issue by card or letter by their deadline (the 1st of January, April, July and October). Upon being invited to join, a Waiting Lister must contribute the remaining \$1 dues and 6 pages minimum activity requirements before the mailing deadline.

Waiting Listers may not put a zine into the mailing while on the Waiting List, unless that zine is "franked" with a regular members zine.

Wives/Husbands of members can become "Instant Members" by doing a zine of their own. See activity requirements.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: Under no circumstances should any member expect the OE to look for a COA in zines. Be sure to notify the OE by card, letter or a note with the zines if you want your mailing. The PO may not get it to you otherwise.

OFFICERS: The Offical Editor (OE) is elected in the January mailing and assumes control after the April mailing. The OE does all the work, gets all the glory/blame and makes all the rules. The OEs decisions are final, short of Total Insurrection. Emergency Officer (EO) is responsible for doing the OEs work in case of emergency. The OE may appoint other officers as needed, and that the President is ALWAYS the top winner in the latest Pillar Poll and that all members not holding any other office are automatic Vice Presidents of SAPS.

EXTRA MATLINGS: Are for Sale! \$1 each from the OE, just write and ask. We also have 40 zines (OEs choice) of scattered goodies from mailing 95 to date. All those extra zines members send.

PILLAR POLL: Ballots are distributed with the January mailing and the results are tabulated in the April mailing. On these ballots we elect the next OE and vote points toward the egoboo of our favorite SAP. The SAPSmember with the most points is President of SAPS for the next four mailings.

MORALS: It is I*M*M*O*R*A*L to miss a mailing!

It is very MORAL to have at least 6 pages in every mailing.
