Officers

The Official Editor(OE) is the ruling body. He makes, changes, interprets or ignores the laws. He handles all Saps business, publishes the OO, and assembles & mails the bundles.

The Emergency Officer(EO) serves as a stand-in for the OE whenever it is necessary.

The Vice Presidents(VP) - all members of Saps but the OE and the EO are vice-presidents of the group. This is merely necessary egoboo and serves to inhibit incipient inferiority complexes.

Elections: The OE is supposedly elected to office but of late there have been no bids and thus no elections. The OE serves four terms and if no one bids for the office, the OE either appoints a member to follow him or else, he continues in the office until tired of it or a replacement found. Any member in good standing is eligible for the office of OE and is free to nominate himself for the office. The OE appoints his EO. NOMINATIONS FOR THE OFFICE OF OE MUST BE IN TO ME BY MAILING # 31 (deadline 2nd Sat. Mar). BALLOTS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED IN THE 31ST MAILING AND RESULTS, IF ANY, ANNOUNCED IN THE 32ND MAILING.

The OE may ask for an advisory vote but is not bound to accept the verdict.

Dues:

Dues are \$1.50 PER THREE MAILINGS. If a Saps is dropped from membership before the period covered by his dues is up, he forfeits the balance. If the treasury should need it at any time, the OE may assess the members for whatever amount he deems pertinent.

Activity:

A member must publish a minimum of six pages every six months. The six pages may be divided between two consecutive mailings but any two-mailing-period must have a minimum of six pages from each member. A page is regarded as one side of a letter-sized (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ X 11 inch) sheet of single space typing or something requiring equivalent effort. Any leaway granted is up to the judgement of the OE.

Postmailings:

Postmailings do not count toward activity credit at any time, and have only an unofficial standing in the records.

Eligible Material :

Reprint material and any material seeing prior distribution, is not given activity credit though such material will be accepted once you've your basic requirements in. It is hoped that a substantial part of your contribution will be your own work. The OE has the right of censorship, and can reject or censor any material he feels would upset the PO. All zines must be duplicated by a method acceptable to the PO as "identical". In short, no coloring, no hand painting, no words written in, etc.

Mailing deadlines:

Zines must be delivered on or before the deadlines which are the second Saturdays of March, June, September, and December. At least forty copies must be submitted. Each member is given the credit for all the material (original) in his zine, unless he indicates otherwise.

RULES OF SAPS(continued)

New members must submit their minimum activity requirements and their dues before being allowed membership. Should a waiting lister not take advantage of an offered opening, he will be dropped to the bottom of the list. If he still makes no move, then he will be dropped altogether. If he cannot make it when his opening appears but informs the OE in time to be given another chance, he retains his position at the top of the waiting list. All waiting listers will receive the OO.

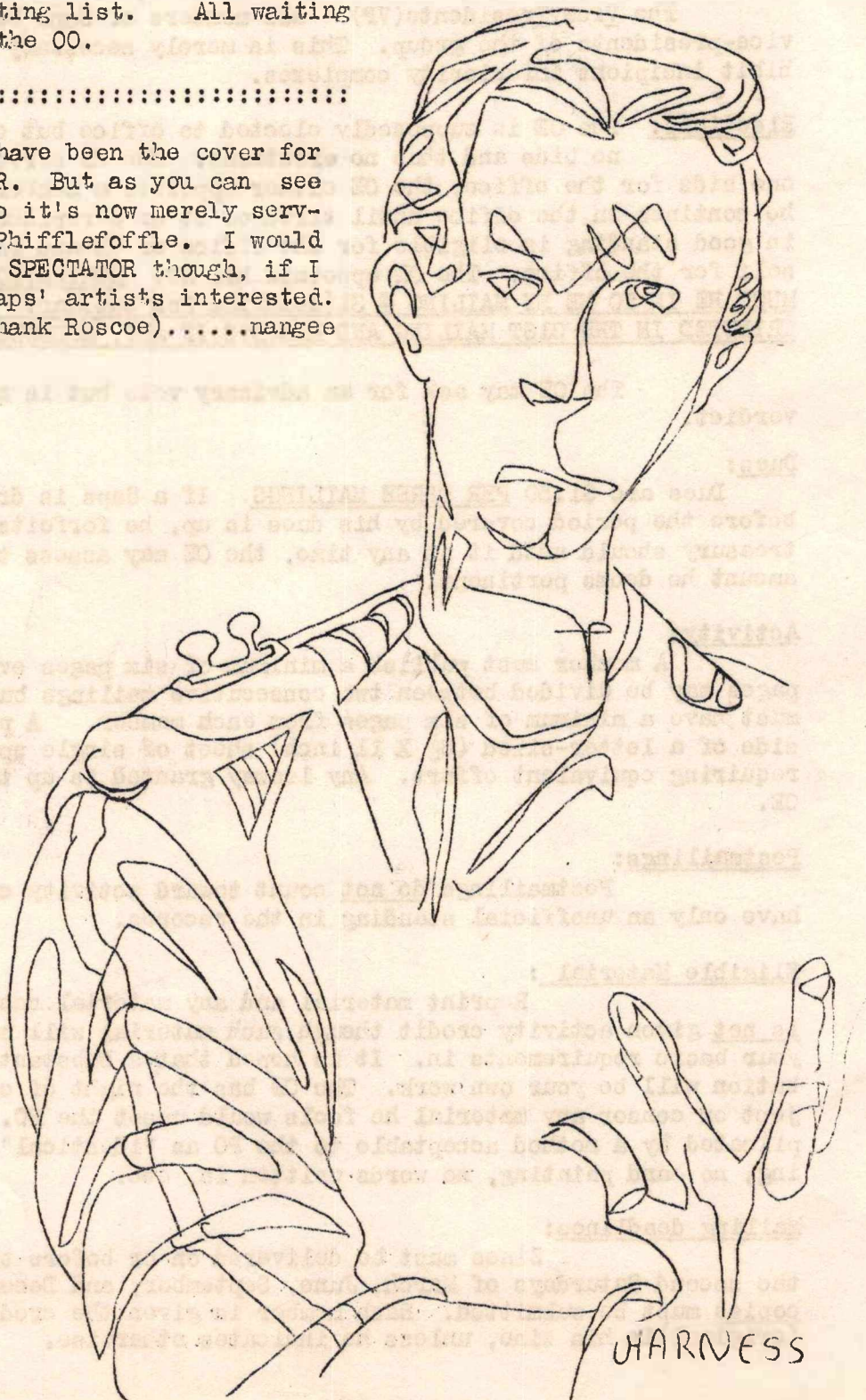
