THE RULES OF SAPS

The Spectator Amateur Press Society exists for the purpose of exchanging magazines produced by the members, which are sent to the Official Editor and distributed to the membership in quarterly bundles. Aside from this practically anything goes.

Rules, however, are published as a part of the official organ just to let the members know what the Official Editor is up to. The rules for this quarter are:

(1) Membership in SAPS is limited to 35 members.

(2) Each member must, to retain membership, demonstrate continued interest by contributing a minimum of six quarto pages of his/her original unpublished work every six months. Contributions must be legibly reproduced and sent to the Official Editor in an edition of at least 40 copies. Material not distributed as a part of the mailing bundle is not listed as part of the mailing or recognized as activity constituting a contribution. APA X allows this sort of thing, but we don't.

(3) Membership dues are \$2.50 per year, due 15 days before the dead-

line date of your last mailing under your current membership.**

(4) Applicants for membership, when no openings on the membership roster exist (which is most of the time) are placed on a Waiting List for admission, and receive copies of the Official Organ. In order to remain on the Waiting List they must indicate continued interest by acknowledging receipt of the Official Organ within one month of the mailing deadline date. (Time-extensions are granted fans living outside North America.) On being invited tojoin they must contribute six pages (minimum) of activity, representing the required activity for their first six months of membership, and the normal dues.

(5) Each year, with the January mailing, ballots are distributed for the election of the Official Editor and for the conduct of the Pillar Poll. The latter is a categorized laureate poll based on the material in the previous year's mailings, and the winner becomes titular President of SAPS.

(6) The Official Editor makes all rules of SAPS, and handles all official business. All material intended for a mailing must be in his hands by the deadline for that mailing.

- (7) The Official Editor exercises no personal restrictions on the nature of contributions to the mailing. However, since the mailing bundles are sent out under his name, he may reject any item violating the Post Office's prejudices.
- (8) In addition to, and notwithstanding, any rule set forth above, or any provision of federal, state, or local constitutions, public law, social realism, or even common fairness, the Official Editor retains the right to deal with any situation which may arise in the operation of SAPS -- and also to tear down and raise up, loose and bind, coin money with his own superscription and image, impose taxes, levy war, issue letters of marque and reprisal, and take any other action needful to maintain the Spectator Amateur Press Society. In brief, he is Evil and his heart is Black.

LEGISLATION OF MORALS:

- (1) It is considered immoral to miss a mailing. Eva Firestone, Jack Harness. Bob Leman, Ray Schaffer, and Guy Terwilleger are guilty of the charge of immorality on this specification.
- (2) It is considered moral to notify the OE in advance of intent to leave. On this ground Lynn Hickman and Es Adams are declared moral, though missing.
- (3) It is considered immoral to tuck notes to the OE inside your bundle of SAPS zines, partly because it'll cost like hell if the Post Office catches you and partly because they won't be found until too late -- packages stack more conveniently if they aren't unwrapped, you see. Recommended procedure for people who want to be notified of the arrival of their mags are advised to drop me a line under separate cover, with a returnaddressed envelope - or better, postcard - included. Al Lewis is guilty of violation of this point of morals and is denied activity credit for the offending publication and assessed penalty activity of twelve pages for the next mailing.
