This is the Official Organ of the Spectator Amateur Press Society, an organization for exchanging fanzines...and shame on you for a week if you didin't know that already. To ef-

fect this objective and thus [so Hari Seldon tells me] prevent the collapse of civilization, we have certain rules for the membership:

1. Membership in SAPS is limited to 35 persons; married couples, however, are considered one, share one membership, and receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.

2. Continued interest in the club is a requisite for membership. Each full member, to retain membership, must contribute a minimum of six quarto pages of original unpublished work in a six-month period. Such contributions must be legibly reproduced and sent to the Official Editor in an edition of at least 42 copies. There is no restriction on the nature of a member's contribution except the Post Office's opinions on mailability, which we gotta consider until such time as we are able to Take Over and set up a code of our own. [You see, there'll be compensating features even for the collapse of Western civilization.] Material not distributed as part of the Mailing Bundle is not listed as part of the mailing or recognized as activity constituting a contribution.

3. Dues for membership are \$2 per year, due 15 dzys before the deadline date of the first mailing of your new year.

4. Applicants for membership, when no openings on the membership roster exist [which is most of the time] are placed on a waiting list for admission, and receive copies of the official organ, SPECTATOR. In order to retain their places on the waiting list they must indicate continued interest by acknowledging receipt of the official organ within one month of the mailing deadline-date. (Time-extensions are granted fans living outside North America.) On being invited to join they must, before the next deadline, contribute six pages (minimum) of activity, representing the required activity for their first six months of membership, and the normal dues.

5. Each year, with the January mailing, ballots are distributed for the election of an Official Editor (who takes office following the April mailing), and for the conduct of the Pillar Poll. The latter is a laureate poll based on the mailings of the previous year; its winner becomes titular President of SAPS.

6. The Official Editor makes all rules (limited only by custom and the Sacred Right of Insurrection) and transacts all official business. All material intended for a mailing must be in his hands by the deadline for that mailing, at which time he assembles from this material 42 identical bundles for distribution to the membership and, on an availability basis, to Waiting-Listers. A charge of 25¢ per hundred pages is made for bundles going to waiting-listers.

7. Pilar Poll [especially for Hemingway fans?] this year is being conducted by Lee Jacobs of the Van Nuys, California, Jacobses. All members are admonished to get their ballets in to him by 1 March 1961 (15 March 1961 for you, John and Klaus), complete with votes if at all convenient. Or you could leave them blank and let him fill the spaces in as necessary.

8. Running for Official Editor for the coming year are Burnett R TOSKEY, Bruce PELZ, and a joint ticket of Bob LICHTMAN and Don DURWARD. In the case of the two latter, whose joint candidacy is unprecedented, it is ruled that if elected each will be responsible for all official gaffes. No evasion here!!
