

Rules of SAPS

1. Membership: Limited to 36 members. Married couples are considered one membership, but receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.

2. Activity: Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of original material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the official Editor inan edition of at least 42 copies. Reprints do not count — and that includes anything previously sent through another APA before SAPS. Use of someone else's artwork may count up to one page of credit, and use of your own up to three pages. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings are not credited, but the following were postmailed illegally to the 59th Mailing: SpeleoBem 16.1 (Pelz - lp.)

The Rest of MEST (Johnstone - 15p.)
Grendel (Foyster - 18p.)

3. Dues: \$2.00 per year, payable before the deadline of the last mailing of your current membership year. From all indications, another free year of dues will be forthcoming, but all members whose dues are payable before either Mailing 61 or Mailing 62 will have to pay them before getting the extra free year, as this largess can be given only every four mailings.

4. Waiting List: When no openings in the membership exist, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. Members of the waiting list must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR within one month of the mailing, in order to retain their places on the list (time extensions granted to overseas fans.) A fee of \$1 will be charged for admission to the WL, payable to the OE within one month of the mailing in which you first appear on the list. The fee is applied to the first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to drop-

outs. On being invited to join, a WIer must contribute the remaining dues and six pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadline. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a 50-cent fine, deducted from the WL fee and not refunded.

5. Officers: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of January, April, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis - to the WLers. The charge for a mailing sent to a WIer is 25¢ per hundred pages or substantial fraction thereof (\$1 minimum). Any Wler wishing to circulate his zine in themailing may do so at a cost of 25ϕ per sheet (2pp.) The OE is elected every year at the January mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titulat office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous

year, and also distributed with the January mailing.

All other members of SAPS are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the

OE may appoint other officers at whim.

6. Immorality: It is immoral to miss a mailing. The following are immoral on this ground: Elinor Busby, Gordon Eklund, Jane Gallion, Art Rapp, Nancy Rapp, and Bob Smith. It is also immoral to wait and get dropped instead of resigning and giving someone else an early chance at the membership. All three dropouts are thereby immoral. It is not immoral to argue with the OE, just foolhardy.

NOTE WELL: Waiting listers must acknowledge by 20 August. Invitees must acknowledge by 20 August and get dues and activity in by 15 October. Members must get dues and activity in by 15 October.
