1.Membership: Limited to 36 members. Married couples are considered one membership, but receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.
2.Activity: Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of original material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the Official Editor in an edition of at least 42 copies. (43, to provide UCLA with a copy for its SF collection, would be appreciated.) Reprints or priorly distributed material does not count. Use of your own artwork may count up to three pages of credit, use of someone else's only up to 1 page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings are not credited, and since the mess of them last mailing, they are Erowned Upon.
3. Dues: $\$ 2.00$ per year, payable before the deadline of the last mailing of your current membership year. All members of SAPS in good standing as of 15 January 1963 (with the exception of the three new members) have been granted another year of free dues. The "Dues Payable" table on the roster page has been changed to reflect this.
4. Waiting List: When no openings exist in the membership, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. Members of the waiting list must acknowledge receipt of SPECTATOR within one month of the mailing in order to retain their places on the list. Time extensions are granted to overseas members. A fee of $\$ 1$ will be charged for admission to the w, pay-

able to the OE within one month of the mailing in which you first appear on the list. The fee is applied to the first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to drop-outs. On being invited to join, a WLer must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadine. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a $50 \not \subset$ fine, deducted from the WL fee and not refundable.
5. Officers: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15 th of January, April, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis - to the VLers. The charge for a mailing sent to a NLer is $25 \phi$ per hundred pages or substantial fraction thereof ( $\$ 1$ minimum). Any WLer wishing to circulate his zine in the mailing may do so at a cost of $25 \phi$ a sheet ( 2 pages). The OE is elected every year at the Jonuary mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year, and also distributed with the January mailing.

All other members of SAPS are titular vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the OE may appoint other officers at whim.
6. Immorality: It is immoral to miss a mailing. The following are immoral on this ground: Larry Anderson, Terry Carr, Gary Deindorfer, Art and Nancy Rapp. It is also immoral to wait and get dropped instead of resigning and giving someone else an early chance at the membership. Both nemmon and McInerney are thus immoral. It is not immoral to argue with the OE, just foolhardy and unavailing.

NOTE NELL: WAITING-LISTERS must acknowledge and pay HL fee by 20 Feb. INVITEES must acknowledge by 20 February and get dues and activity in by 15 April. MEMBERS myst get activity in by 15 April.
