1. NEMBERSHIP: Limited to 36 members. Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.
2. ACTIVITY: Each member must contribute at least six quarto pages of original material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the Official Editor in an edition of at least 42 copies ( 43 copies, to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated.) Anyone sending less than 42 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorly-distributed material does not count for credit. Use of your own artwork may count up to three pages of credit out of the six, use of someene else's only up to one page. The of will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings are not credited, under any circumstances.
3.DUES: $\$ 2.00$ per year, payable before the deadine of the last mailing in your current member'ship year. Old members who have managed to remain with us up to this mailing will note that they have again received a year's free dues.
3. WAITING LIST: When no openings exist in the membership, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. Members of the waiting list mist acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continued interest in membership, within one month of the mailing, in order to retair their places on the waiting list. Time extensions will be granted to overseas WLers, if there are any. A fee of $\$ 1$ will be charged for admission to the waiting list, payable to the OE within one month of the time your name appears on the WL. This fee is applied to first year's dues, but is not refundable to dropouts. On being invited to join, a WLer must
contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadline. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a $50 \%$ fine, deducted from the WL fee and not refundable.
4. OFFICERS: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15 th of January, April, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis -- to the WLers. The charge for a mailing sent te a WLer is $25 \notin$ per hundred pages or substantial fraction thereof (\$I minimum). Any WLer wishing to circulate his zine in the mailing may do so at a cost of 256 per sheet ( 2 pages), if he can't get some member to frank it in. The of is elected every year at the fanuary mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year and also distributed with the January mailing.

All other members of SADS are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the oE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the OE•may*appoint other officers at whim.
6. IMMORALITY: It is immoral to miss a mailing, and this time we have Armistead, Breen, Johnstone, Kaye on the Immoral Mailing-Missers list. Better than usual. It is also immoral to wait and get dropped rather than resign and let someone else have your membership early.
7. STUPIDITY: It is extremely stupid not te read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELi=: WAITING-IISTERES must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 February. =—— MEMBERS must get activity in by 15 April.
