19. MEMBERSHIP: Limited to 35 members. Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges sep-
arately.
20. ACTIVITY. Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of his own material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the OE in an edition of at least 42 copies ( 43 , to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated.) Anyone sending in less than 42 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorlydistributed material do not count for credit. Your own art may count up to 3 pages of credit out of the 6 , or someone else's art may count up to 1 page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings will not be credited.
21. DUES: $\$ 2$ per year, payable before the deadine of your lasi paid-up mailing, as listed next to your name and address in the SPECTATOR. Members in good standing as of January 151965 have once again been credited with one year's free dues. Even with the difference between Book Rate and Library Materials, we will be able to hold off dues for several years with so high a Treasury.
4.WAITING LIST: When no openings exist in the roster, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. The Whers must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continued interest in membership, within one minth after it is sent out, in order to retain their places on the WL. Time extensions will be granted to overseas WLers. A $\$ 1$ fee will be charged for admission to the WL, payable to the OE within 1 month of the time your name appears on the WL. This fee is applicable to your first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to drop-outs. On being invited join, a WLer must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing. Declining an offered membership to return to the bottom of the WL will result in a $50 \notin$ fine, deductable from the $W \mathrm{l}$ fee and not refundable.
5.OFFICERS: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15 th of Jan, Apr, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and, on an availability basis, to the WLers. Price of a WL mailing is $25 \notin / 100$ pages or substantial portion thereof, $\$ 1$ minimum. The OE is elected each year with the January mailing, and takes office following the April mailing.

The President is a titular office granted the member placing highest on the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year and circulated with the January mailing.

All other members are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the $O E$ may appoint other officers at whim.
6. IMMORALITY, ETC.: It is immoral to miss a mailing - like Anderson, Baker, Breen, Carr, Johnstone, Lewis, Meskys have done this time. It is extremely stupid not to read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELL: WLers must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 February (Blum \& Brandon have until 1 April).
The Invitee must acknowledge the Invitation by 20 February , and get activity in by 15 April.
