*Only 39 copies received. Member's mailing will be shorted, and his dues docked one mailing's worth. (And the UCLA Library would appreciate a donation of a copy of this zine, along with WILD COLONIAL BOY 14, NIFIHEIM, and MAINE-IAC, the only others not to send 41)

Credit last mailing (2 pages) included a page of Ross Chamberlain's artwork. This zine includes another page of non-member artwork, which is against the rules. Under the Hannifen precedent, member is retained on roster and fined six additional pages, making him owe 8 pages in mailing 74.

1. MEMBERSHIP: Limited to 32 members. Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.

2.ACTIVITY: Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of his own material in any period of two consecutive mailings, to be sent to the OE in an edition of at least 40 copies (41, to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated.) Anyone sending in less than 40 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorly distributed materials do not count for credit. Your own art may count up to 3 pages of activity out of the 6, or someone els's art may count up to one page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings will not be credited.

3.DUES: \$2 per year, payable before the deadline of your last paid-up mailing, as listed next to your name in the SPECTATOR.

4.WAITING LIST: When no openings exist in the roster, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. The WLers must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continued interest in membership, within one month after it is sent out, in order to retain their places on the WL. This fee is applicable to your first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to drop-outs. On being invited to join, a WLer must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a 50¢ fine, deductable from the WL fee and not refund-

5.OFFICERS: The Official Editor makes all the rules and transacts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of Jan, Apr, July, or Oct. 40 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members, and, on an availability basis, to the WLers. Price of a WL mailing is 25%/100 pages or substantial portion thereof; \$1 minimum. The OE is elected each year with the January mailing and takes office following the April mailing.

The President is a titular office granted the member placing highest on the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year and circu-

lated with the January mailing.

All other members are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the OE may appoint other officers at whim.

6. IMMORALITY, ETC .: It is immoral to miss a mailing. It is extremely stupid not to read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELL: WLers must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 November. (Overseas deadline: 1 January). DO IT N*O*W!! Members must get dues and activity in by 15 January. Invitees must acknowledge by 20 November, and get d&a in by 15 January. The following members owe dues and activity in the coming quarter:
