Rutes of Saps(subject to change or amendment by David Hulan)

1. 30 Bundles will be sent out to the membership. Married couples may be considered one member, but can, if they both equal indivedual membership requirements, be given seperate activity credit and voting rights. If less than indivicual requirements are furnished by one, it shall be up to the judgement of the OE as to the validity of that membership. At least one of the couple must cio full requirements.
2. A member is required to furnish at least 6 pages of his own material in any period of two consecutive mailings. No rerprints or post mailings accepted for page credit, nor will post mailings be allowed any status under normal condita ions. At least 36 copies of this zine must be sent to the OE and those 36 copies must get there by the deadline.
3. Deadlines will be set by the $O E$ and will normally fall in the months of July, October, January and April. Exact date of the deadline will be given on the first page of the 00 .
4. Dues are $\$ 2$ a year payable before the fourth mailing of your membership as listed next to your name in the 00 .
5. Wisters must acknowlege receipt of the Spectator by the designated date given for such acknowlegement; must pay $\$ 1.00$ on joining the K , and must send the other $\$ 1$. plus a minimum of 6 creditable pages by the next deadine after he receives his invitation.

Extra mailings will be sent to WL members at $25 \phi / 100$ pages ( $\$ 1.00$ minimum) for as long as they last. Some effort will be made to give invitees a bundle, but
fere after that it is a fight. Wl members can only order the next mailing(or any left over current one, and cannot build up credit in advance.
6. The $O E$ is elected in the January mai ling and assumes control after the ipril mailing is sent out. The OE makes and is the law of SAPSand runs the organization as best he dares.

Our Pop Ten WLers, voted by 11 persons, are: 1.Weber, 2.Atkins, 3.Murray, 4.Mann, 5.Pfeifer, 6.Stevens, 7.Staton, 8.Smith, 9.Lewis, and 10. Dupree. J Hebbert came close even though he is a member, and thus in double jeopardy or somthing. Like maybe kidding...

The SAPS Popularity Contest: Art Rapp pointed out that my scoring system allowed prolific voters to put in too many points, and he was right. In return he suggested a system that could have allowed one voter to give his buddy no less than 2nd place (though this didn*t happen, while by my system two voters put in most of the points). So I scored by both systems and by 3 intermediate systems that gave nothing but intermediate results. The overall result is that [since each system coincidentally had a 3-way tie for loth place] SAPS' Pop Ten is 17 people: besides your top ten in the Pillar Poll TOTALS column, SAPS dearly loves Bailes, Cox; Devore, Eklund,Fitch, Patten and Toskey [and I put them into alphabetical order; you didn't]. Only 8 voted this experimental category, and while I think it was worth trying once, just to *see*, I don't think it is worthwhile trying it again. We can get the same rsult by not being too proud to borrow a good idea from FAPA: the "Favorite Unsung.." category, which is what Miscellaneous has been tendingtoward for several years. Comments exceed space here: the main thing is that Voters are neglecting the categories of Verse, Artwork and Fiction: on 1.6 ballots, $48 \%$ of Art points were voted, $60 \%$ for verse and $73 \%$ for fiction, as compared to over $90 \%$ for Zines, MCs and Articles, $\varepsilon 82 \%$ for Humor. Some re-evaluation seems in order. Sorry to have to omit t服䡙methts; there were some good ones.
