# 1996 TAFF Ballot

What is TAFF? - The Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund was created in 1953 for the purpose of providing funds to bring well-known and popular fans familiar to those on both sides of the ocean across the Atlantic. Since that time, TAFF has regularly brought North American fans to European conventions and European fans to North American conventions. TAFF exists solely through the support of fandom. The candidates are voted on by interested fans all over the world, and each vote is accompanied by a donation of not less than \$2 or £1. These votes and the continued generosity of fandom, are what make TAFF possible.

Who may vote? - Voting in the 1996 race is open to anyone who was active in fandom prior to September 1994 (or who has a convincing story) and who contributes at least \$2 or £1 to the Fund. Larger contributions are recommended for those without references. Voting is by secret ballot; only one vote per person, and you must sign your ballot. You may change your vote and/or name at any time prior to the deadline.

Deadline - Votes in this race must reach the administrators by midnight April 29, 1996.

Voting Details - TAFF uses the New Zealand ballot system which guarantees automatic runoffs no matter who's in the lead. You rank the candidates in the exact order of your preference for having them visit (or leave) your country for a while. Details on how the ballots are counted and distributed are available upon request... however, if you really wanted your candidate to win, you'd increase your contribution (see Who may vote? above).

Hold Over Funds - This choice, like "No Award" in Hugo balloting, gives you the chance to vote for no TAFF trip this year, if the candidates are not appealing or just not faaaaanish enough. Hold Over Funds may be voted in any position; thus, should it receive a majority of the votes on the final ballot, the funds will be Held Over the hands of the candidates. They are thus taunted until they develop more interesting platforms.

No Preference - Some people just don't care who wins but still have too much money. We heartily encourage their participation.

**Donations** - TAFF gratefully accepts your freely given money and material for auction; such generosity has sustained the Fund for 40 years (really!). TAFF is fandom's oldest travel fund and one of its worthiest causes - give early and often! Please contact your nearest administrator for details.

Candidates - Each candidate has posted a bond, promising - barring Acts of God, or aversion to hot weather -- to travel to L.A.con III, the 1996 World Science Fiction Convention in Anaheim, California, USA, August 29-September 2, 1996 if elected, and has provided signed nominations and a platform (overleaf -- sort of).
