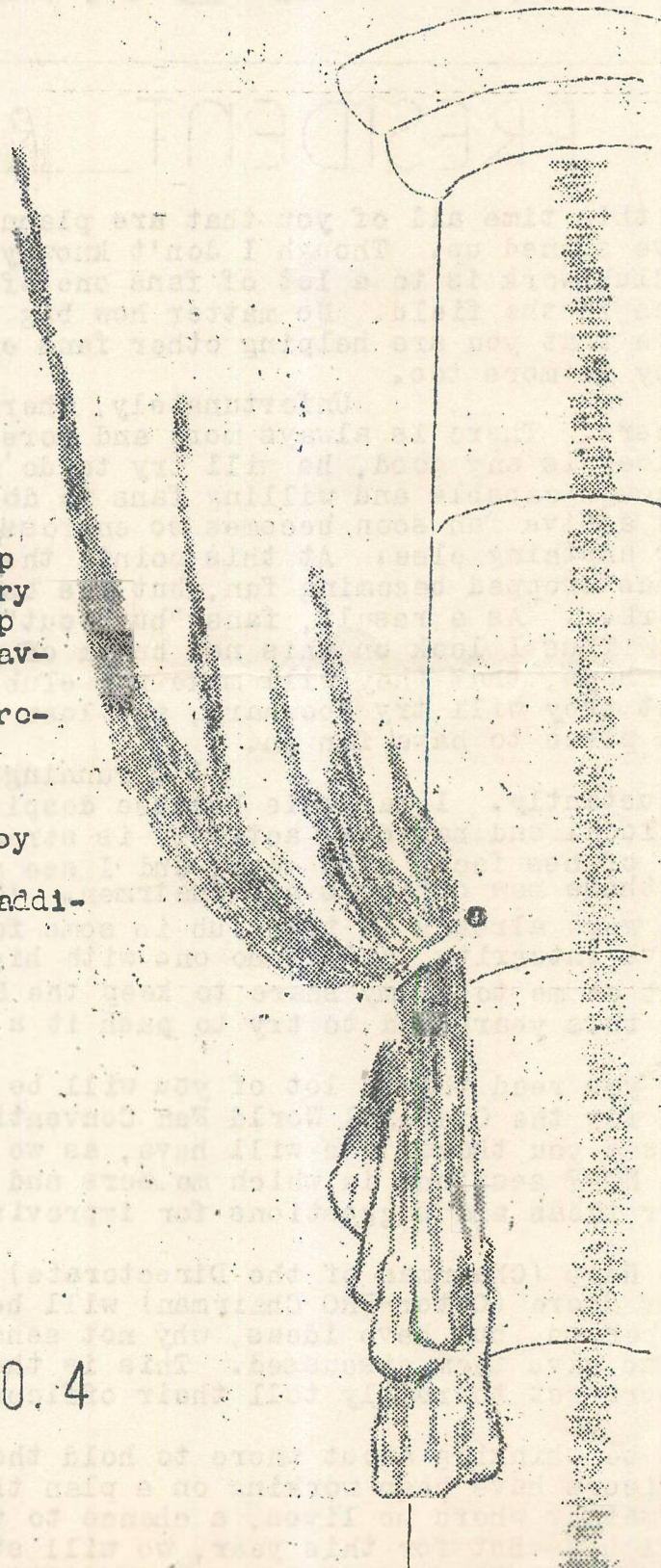

REPORTS to the MEMBERSHIP

NBF PRESIDENT RICK SNEARY

By this time all of you that are planning to run for office this Fall have signed up. Though I don't know your names yet, I wish you luck. Club work is to a lot of fans one of the most satisfying experiences in the field. No matter how big or small your job is, the knowledge that you are helping other fans enjoy the field more, makes you enjoy it more too.

Unfortunately, there is a high mortality rate on officers. There is always more and more for one to do. And if the officer is any good, he will try to do more and more. There are never enough capable and willing fans to do the work. The result is that the active fan soon becomes so engrossed in the work he has no time for anything else. At this point, the average actifan finds that fandom has stopped becoming fun, but has become work. And no fan likes work... As a result, fans "burn out" and drop out of active circles. Thus I look on this new bunch of candidates with hope and sorrow. Hope, that they will make the club better, and sorrow for fear that they will try too hard, and lose sight of the fact that fandom is a place to have fun in.

I'm running for re-election, but somewhat reluctantly. I say this because despite efforts, the conflict between local and national activity is strong. Secondly, there will be a lot of new faces next year, and I see a long time devoted to adjusting these new officers and Chairmen. (This year nearly all the officers were already in the club in some form, and knew each other.) But I have integrity, and if no one with high ambitions appears, you can count on me to do my share to keep the NFFF on the same level it has been this year, and to try to push it a few more notches up.

About the time you read this a lot of you will be getting ready to go to Portland for the Official World Fan Convention. I hope if all goes well to see you there. We will have, as we have at the past Conventions, a NFFF session, in which members and officers get together and talk over ideas and suggestions for improving the club.

As it looks now, Art Rapp (Chairman of the Directorate), Jimmy Taurasi (Director), and Harry Moore (Outer-PRO Chairman) will be there. If you can't attend in person, but have ideas, why not send them to one of these officers and have them discussed. This is the one chance each year that the members get to really tell their officers off.

At the same time, you will be thinking about where to hold the next year's Convention. Your officers have been working on a plan that will give every active fan, no matter where he lives, a chance to vote on where the Convention will be. But for this year, we will still have to vote at the Convention. At the moment I, as an individual fan, think that New Orleans is most deserving and most eager to have it. They have tried

for two years now, and there have been no Conventions in that area before. This is not an official endorsement by the NFFF, but at this time I, personally, would recommend them.

I'd like to end by saying something about the NFFF-sponsored subzines, POSTWARP, FUTURIST, and ALEPH-NULL. It was felt that the O-O could not give you the varied material you wanted. The O-O is a place for business and reports to you and by you. We felt that with the backing and money of the NFFF it would be possible to create fanzines that would act as supplements to the O-O. POSTWARP gives the members a chance to talk over anything, and at any length. FUTURIST deals with the more serious side of science fiction, and presents articles by fans tops in their field. ALEPH-NULL also fills this need. They are subzines merely because to print them free for each member in addition to the O-O would wipe out the treasury. This way, we felt that members interested in that sort of thing could get the zines if they want them, or not, as they please. These magazines are yours. The Directorate has selected the fans we believe best suited to edit them. If you are not satisfied with them we can remove the present editors and get new ones. You are not only the subscribers, but you are, in the long run, also the stock-holders.

Reluctantly, I am forced to toss somewhat of a monkey-wrench into the NFFF administrative machinery by announcing my resignation as head of the NFFF Board of Directors. The reason; my departure for military duty. I trust all N3F members will agree that the war is more important than any form of fanactivity.

The chief new business which the Directorate has considered lately is membership pins for those who belong to N3F. Nothing definite can be announced until various manufacturers quote prices, but it seems likely that some arrangement for NFFF pins will be made.

Look for the NFFF display at the Norwescon; application blanks will be available there so that you can get your non-NFFF friend to join, with the array of NFFF publications and other material handy to illustrate your sales talk.

The Sec-Treas reports very little response to the call for candidates for next year's offices. This is a rare chance for some of you fans who have been pointing out how the club should be run, to put your theories into action.

It seems as if many members pay little attention to TNFF -- the officers get queries on every subject from "How much are the dues this year?" to "What is Sneary's address?" And many members complain that they don't know what benefits are available or who to contact in order to get them. Economy prohibits us from listing each benefit on a separate page, complete with a scarlet border around it and step-by-step instructions on how to go about receiving it. Sure the members of NFFF are intelligent to read the text of the material in WNFF, not just the captions? The ten pages or so devoted to the membership roster every six months don't do much good if you would rather write us to learn someone's address than look it up there. And the notation of dues paid on the roster is supposed to save us from having to announce individually to 400

people that they are about to become ex-members. The NFFF isn't a club operated by a few people for the benefit of a lot of others. It is a club in which each member has the responsibility of helping to keep things going. If each member would do 1/400th of the administrative work of the club, we wouldn't have the "burned out" officers that Rick mentions.

Here's wishing NFFF a bright and successful future despite the complications which the war is certain to bring to fandom. See ya later...

Dear Art: Maybe I'm too late to get my two cents worth in on the Activities Requirement Plan but as it is tentatively set up I am afraid that I might find myself barred from the NSF which I would regret since I am interested in fan activities and like to read about them. Take a breath, that sentence was beginning to get away from me. Being older than most fans, I lack the time (also the talent) for writing or publishing, also possibly I feel too dignified (or is stuffy the word?) to take part in some of the juvenile feuds carried on by letterhacks among the fans. I have been a reader of science-fiction since the earliest Gernsback days and though never before an actifan I have watched the growth and development of fandom and like to feel that in a small way I too belong.

Now may I make a suggestion of an amendment to the plan which will permit you to keep the passive members and their dues but will vest control in the more active members, at the same time encouraging the passive members to join the active list by engaging in some fan activity. That practically tells the idea in itself but I will give an illustration. I am a member of the Columbus Players Club, a little theatre group. Before the war, their membership was divided into active and passive members. Only active members could vote for Directors and the Directorate chose officers and determined policy. The President (chosen by Directors) chose committee chairmen who in turn picked their committees. This does not need to affect you however because what I meant to bring out was that passive members paid dues and got to see the plays (which were not open to the public). A passive member could become active any year by performing some activity such as acting, stagecraft, publicity, clerical work, etc. Being active gave him not only a vote but also the opportunity to attend club nites when amateur vaudeville skits were given, play reading meetings, seminars, and the like.

In the case of the NSF, you could have passive members who pay dues and get TNFF also eligibility to subscribe to other fanzines but not at a reduced rate which could be reserved for the actives along with the vote and possibly some other attractions. Passives could become active at any time they complied with the requirements. How about it?
