# N'AFA REPORT

(for the information of new members, N"APA is the amateur press association of the NFFF. The only requirement is that you be a NFFF member, and send roughly 35 copies (identical) to the Official Editor often enough to meet activity requirements. For more information, write D K Patrick, 27 Silver Birch Road, Turnersville, NJ, 08012. Many fan publishers have learned how to edit and publish a fanzine by starting out in an apa like N"APA. And if you need material for your first issue, just write the Manuscript Bureau and get some, free. ——Joanne Burger)

N'APA currently has about fifteen members, depending what month you care to ask. Total number of pages per mailing is running between 1.00 and 1.50. The ZINE POIL, a vote by the membership on the most interesting zine of the past mailing, has generated some interest in the apa. We are, of course, looking for members. The dues, instead of being \$2, are floating between \$1. and \$2. This is a result of an amendment to the bylaws that stipulate the dues should cover the cost of mailings. Two members, Irvin Koch and Larry Nielson, have proposed complete rewrites of the bylaws in an effort to boost interest and frequency. ERIS has suggested 'between mailing mailings' of limited size to allow quicker response to hot issues but this would not count towards the page requirements. The official editor (myself) included the rules of the Cult. I hope to get further response and include other apa's bylaws for comparison. Each mailing of the apa is able to sell a couple of bundles which indicates interest on the part of others. In fact, except for one instance, those that have purchased bundles have joined. So why not throw in a dollar for the bundle? Information and bundles can be obtained by writing me directly. -- D K Patrick.

# ROUND ROBINS REPORT

Bound Robins are not only a fun way of communication, they are also a very informative and effective means of communication as well. This is because several people are writing to several others at one time. Most RBs are comprised of from four to six people--whatever the instigator decides is a good number for the group--or whatever the group itself decides. Also the Boule Sheet is usually set up geographically so that the RB makes a round trip for this usually saves time on a round.

Basically, an RR letter is an open letter to everyone in the RR; however parts of it may be addressed to specific individuals of the RR even though these may be read by the rest of the RR as well. Most RRs are discussions of various things in and out of fandom. Each RR has its own personality—some are friendly and fannish while others are very sercon. The mood of an RR depends on its members.

RRs may be named or numbered--whatever the group decides on or the instigator decides at the time he starts an RR. Some specialty RRs take their names from their subject matter...for example the Robinners' RR takes its name from the fact that it discusses RRs.

Specialty RRs can be formed with any subject as the main topic of discussion--some are even formed to write a short story, while others discuss things more broadly. In fact some people have expressed an intrest in an all art RR and if anyone would care to be in one, let me know and I'll get you in touch with the people interested in starting one.

An FR can be a great proving ground for ideas for you get more than one view of them and often lots of discussion about them. They can also serve to help a new member learn about the NFFF and a new fan can learn about fandom by giving insights into fandom and introducing several other fen/Neffers at the same time. Another valuable service they perform is experience in letter writing iteslf.
