Reading TIGHTBAM 19 reminded me of several mattere upon which I have some-
thing to 眼, so here goes -
Psi phenomana: One of last yeari projecte which never got off the groumd was the formation of a parapaycholosy eroup in NBF. In fact, it was the prospect of perm ticipating in such an activity wich Ied Nan Gerding to rejoin N3F. Last yearis din. ectorate felt that cuch a group would not be af enough general interest to warrnnt creatiog an official dopartment to hamde it. But as Dr. Ladomko's and itathan BuckIin's letters in TB 19 show there is a considerable aegment of the memberinip who would be interested.

Nangee (Nan Gerding, Box 145, Roserille, Illinots) has been working wh the parapaychology department of Ihke Univorsity for jears, and the last time I talked to her was wiling to 0rganize esp tests and experimenta for any N3F members who were seriously interested in the abject.

Now, as a Director this year, I swing a littic more woight, in some respects. than I did as Presidont lant jear - but I'm otill not going to rush out and introduce a motion that the Nis organize a Paragaychol ogy Bureau for you members int . Fited in euch things. Rather, I'm going to point out that a similar situation exialid. uith roapect to tope-recorder fans awhile back, and instoad of pectering officialdom to create them a bureau, Ron Filik and a fow other enthusiasts went ahead and organ ized themselves, then asked the 135 admindatration to grant official recogaition to their enterprise.

In the worde of the Prophst (ROscoe, not Gau), Go Thou And Isp Likewise: In other words, if you people are really interested in promoting some activity in the fealil of parapaychology, you can get youreelves organiked without our help - because YOU are the ones who know what sort of activity four group wants to undertake. Once you've got the nucleus of a group, then ask the Directorate for assistance, financial or otherwise, and you'll find us falling all over ourselves to help jou make a cuccess of 70 project.

As a start, I'd aggent that any NBF member interented in parapsychology research write to Dr, Ladonko. I'm aure he, with the help of Four euggestions, can take it from there.

Next item: Write-in rotes in NBF elections, and my Machiavellian motives for not allowing them last jear whon I wrote the alection call for TMPF. Mhis is an interesting example of innocent bungling. Tou see, back about 1948 the Directorate passed a motion that Writerin rotes would be permitted in NBF elections. But as the years passed this was forgotten by practically everyone. and when I went to write the election call for the 1962 election, I tried to insure against errors by modeling my mคssage on ore written by Ralph Eolland. Unfortunately, grabbing an old INEIF from the files at random, I chanced upen one which predated the Directorate motion, ayt thus in all insocence I copied the werds "no writemin votes permitted". If I'd kiown that I was Fiolating an anciont Directorate Fule, I'd have beon glad to have allowed witomin votes - al though I can't see any reason why they ghould be permitted. That roason would a willing candidate have for not filing for office in the normal manmer? and if be is unilling to serve, what good will writing in his name on the ballota do?

This letter 18, quite frankiy, political. I'd like the new members of the club, the ones who know littlo or nothing peraonally about the candidates, to understand me a Iittle better. And I'd liso very much to try impressing on the older members - of that fifty percent group that just never geems to vote in the election $\rightarrow$ the necersity for doing so this year, oven if never again.

I've been arcund the club going on ix jeare, nowe A rather active member, too. Mever did hesitate to expreas my ideas in print, whether the ideas were wortinhile or downight ridiculoun. I've been in clage contact with the directors all the ge mears and with the appointed officials as well. often, perhape, I helped them and worked well with them (though new and then $1 t$ geemed I did littie more than irritate them).

Always and forever I have tried to act as apokesman for more and better activiky for the benefit of the neo - the ones who don't really lenow what fandom is all about. These, I think, are the real promise of NIFFs and fandom. Not blg activities and expensive projects, but juat imply people. Unfortumately, few directore in the years I have known, seem to agree. They try to imprope the image of the NBF to the sest of fandom. They go in strongity for numbers (but fail personaliy to give much balp to the younger members when they get them). They generally seem to figure that cilub projects should be set up working smoothly, and then passed on to someone al se with out further effort on their part.

This isn't to auggest that NKI should be a olub completely $f 0$ the neo at all. जerely that these are the members who need the help to learn their warr around, and encouragenent (with a bit of extra effort to make sure they do) to make contact with the people and activities that can make best uee of the talents they have to offer. The older, more established fans, have plenty of things for them if they wieh activity. It is right out in the open to they don't run into any frustrations in gettiog to itn and the reat can easily be left in their own capable bands. But it juat doean't work that way with neon. I think I understand the needs of the nowcomer - and their spem cial potential - as mall as appone olse in this olub. Certainly. I have had plenty of chance to do so. It has, quito bonestly, made me momething of a nulsamoe to the other direotors, yy continual insiatance that this group is desesving of more offort by the club than any of the othars.

The reasons for thie seeming fanaticiam on the subject is quite aimple. It was three incidents that happened to me. The first happened when I just joined the club, right in the middle of one of its completely fannish apelle. stf was completely la nored in those daya. But Seth Johnson came up, whether aceidently or otherwise, with the idea of aending a copy of ny letter to hlm ou to Joan Imerson, and hor letter to me. So when I answered, I wrote to the two of them and added Mike Deckinger to the liat... making a "quad letter". It kept on going for a lomg time.

When you add up the list of what the N3F owes to Seth, this will go Might up neas the top, that he created the "quid" type of latter writing (in eeveral copies) that hae long aince establishod itself as one of the most efficient ways of runaing a conrespondence club such as this. It also, quite inoidentig, kept me from dropplag out of the club after a couple of months.

The next incident is credited to another of our unsung heroes of the club, our good editor of this TIGHIB FAM , Com Carr. The third - and moot important - ineidant, wae another letter in POSTHMRP (which is just another carlier name for TIGHYB Min, Jou know). This was a letter by Joai Cornoll. complatining that she had been a member for a year; ahe had offered to contribute both art and writing when she sent in her application; and not one percon had taken hor up on it!

This was al together too much, of course, and I atill haven't got over it mor over trying to prevent auch a thing from over happening again. In doing so, I have by necessity been forced to became well acquainted with the nowcomers to the club. Had to get to know them as people, not just as names. Small woinder that my whole fanac has been built around the needs and the desires of these youngsters, even to the extent of excluding other equally important perte of the club at fimes. There are rewards, though -- Joni, Mim Dumont, Phil Harrell, and to lesser extents ('cause I didn't need much personal offort) indde Bryant and Bom Mallardi. and the new ones, ilike Shupp, and next in Iine Frank Stodelka, and maybe David Patrick.

So my offort (one might call it my philosophy) for NKF has now settlod down to the following: I, At least one fangine at all times which not only encourages the noos to contribute, but actually prefers them. (The current group of neos hardly need be told what this is now - they haw already found it. Lunatic Eir-Mi ghtiy, Frank Stodolka editing, with myelf as newly appointed co-editor.) After this, 2, for the more proficient who con use personal apd individual attention, the StoryWriting Contest. (The artists, you know, are already taken care of with the fan art schibits.) And there is a final step, 3, for those whiters who are really getting gooda It is run as a personal fanac by a Neffer, but it takes thom outiside the club in many ways and puts them on the road to that long step of breaking intc the prozines. This is the Semi-Fro activity being run by Alma. Hill. If they have talent, and the deep-dom desire to something better, this will holp them bseak through the dead ond of fandom. This particular method of pushing them ahead as fast as possible, may noll eliminate one common trouble for these younger writergs That unexplainable fasination with how easily they can be appiauded for minor efforts when they are capable uf cuing better. This hae probably hindered a good many talented writers from exerting the effort of really trying hard for the promines. They liager so long in fandom they lose their exciting and different viewpoint and enthualasm for stf. Lots of whiters tum into hack witers, they no longer have that special quality all their una, once they turn into formala writere for the fandines. I will mention only Bob Lijverburg, who was in his way a rather unique fan, as uniqueness gotr in favdom of ccurse. The small chance that even one of the joungaters coming up might pasa through all this and still retain the personal touch of a Bradbury in his later writinge, nould more than ropay any amall oncouragoment I might make to belp thom take the first faltering steps toward it.

Beceuse I love sti very much, and wi h to try making the NPFP a part of helping it in whatever way possible, I aik for your vote in this election. The IVBF is the paly organization in fandom that has the ability to actively promote the taleata of those who join us, and wish to put out the affort to holp themselves.

And since ve Cand do this - Wh the least effort to all concerned -- we SEOULD. Isn't this the original purpose of the club, right at the begiuning of the nanatitutioni Nowadaye, it seems to bave drifted into something else, as though the main purpose of the ciub is to perpetuate itself, and ite fannish ingge - as if that could help atI in the alightest.
